The Assembly Housing and Local Government Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 2423.

This bill, as amended, amends P.L.2001, c.289, which was approved on December 28, 2001 and concerns the installation or maintenance of fire protection equipment.

Section 1 of this bill increases the number of public members of the Fire Protection Equipment Advisory Committee from eight to eleven. The bill requires one of the additional public members to be a chief administrator of the fire department of a municipality with a population of 100,000 or more according to the most recent federal decennial census, and requires one of the additional public members to be a representative of a volunteer fire organization. One additional member would be appointed from nominees of the New Jersey State Fire Prevention and Protection Association. Section 1 of the bill also adjusts the terms of office of the members first appointed in order to comport with the addition of three members to the committee.

Section 2 of the bill, as amended, amends the effective date of P.L.2001, c.289, which is scheduled to take effect on the first day of the seventh month next following enactment, or July 1, 2002.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amended section 2 of the bill to delay the effective date of P.L.2001, c.289 until June 30, 2003. The committee amendments also provide that section 24 of P.L.2001, c.289 (C.52:27D-25gg), the section that allows the Commissioner of Community Affairs to promulgate rules and regulations, shall take effect immediately.

As amended, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 1623 (1R).

The Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1623.

As amended by the committee, this bill would amend P.L.2001, c.289, which was approved on December 28, 2001 and concerns the installation or maintenance of fire protection equipment.

Section 1 of this bill would increase the number of public members of the Fire Protection Equipment Advisory Committee from eight to eleven. The bill requires one of the additional public members to be a chief administrator of the fire department of a municipality with a population of 100,000 or more according to the most recent federal decennial census, and requires one of the additional public members to be a representative of a volunteer fire organization. One additional member would be appointed from nominees of the New Jersey State Fire Prevention and Protection Association. Section 1 of the bill also adjusts the terms of office of the members first appointed in order to comport with the addition of three members to the committee.

Section 2 of the bill would delay the effective date of P.L.2001, c.289 from July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003 except for section 24 of that law which section directs the Commissioner of Community Affairs to promulgate rules and regulations immediately.

The bill as introduced would have changed the effective date of P.L.2001, c.289 so that it would have taken effect on the 61st day following promulgation of rules and regulations by the commissioner. The committee amended the bill to replace that provision with the June 30, 2003 effective date.
