N.J.S.11A:6-10 is amended to read as follows: 9 11A:6-10. A leave of absence with pay shall be given to employees 10 who are duly authorized representatives of an employee organization defined as a "representative" in subsection e. of section 3 of P.L.1941, 11 c.100 (C.34:13A-3) and affiliated with the New Jersey Policemen's 12 Benevolent Association, Inc., Fraternal Order of Police, Firemen's 13 14 Mutual Benevolent Association, Inc. or the Professional Fire Fighters 15 Association of New Jersey to attend any State or national convention of the organization, provided, however, that no more than 10 percent 16 of the employee organization's membership shall be permitted such a 17 18 leave of absence with pay, except that no less than two and no more 19 than 10 authorized representatives shall be entitled to such leave, <u>unless</u>¹[<u>negotiated otherwise by the employer and the representatives</u> 20 of the employee association] more than 10 authorized representatives 21 22 are permitted such a leave of absence pursuant to a collective 23 bargaining agreement negotiated by the employer and the representatives of the employee organization¹, and for employee 24 25 organizations with more than 5,000 members, a maximum of 25 authorized representatives shall be entitled to such leave. STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: MARCH 11, 2002

The Assembly State Government Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly, No. 1980.

This bill amends the statutes requiring State and local government agencies to grant convention leave to authorized representatives of certain police and firefighter professional associations.

Current law provides that such leaves may be granted to the lesser of 10 persons or 10 percent of the authorized representatives of an employee organization with 5,000 or fewer members. This bill establishes an exception to this limitation when more than 10 authorized representatives are permitted a leave of absence pursuant to a collective bargaining agreement negotiated by the employer and the employee organization. For employee organizations with more than 5,000 members, 25 is the maximum number of authorized representatives entitled to leave.

The committee amended the bill to clarify that the exception is to allow negotiation only for more than 10 authorized representatives to have a leave of absence and not to allow negotiation to have less than 10.

The Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1980 (1R).

This bill would allow collective bargaining agreements to exceed the statutory maximum of the number of police and firefighters entitled to leave with pay to attend certain conventions.

Current law provides that such leaves may be granted to the lesser of 10 persons or 10 percent of the authorized representatives of an employee organization with 5,000 or fewer members. This bill establishes an exception to this limitation when more than 10 authorized representatives are permitted a leave of absence pursuant to a collective bargaining agreement negotiated by the employer and the employee organization. For employee organizations with more than 5,000 members, the bill would not change the maximum of 25 authorized representatives entitled to leave under current law.
