The Assembly Health and Human Services Committee reports favorably an Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 701.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee reports favorably a Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 499.

This committee substitute requires that home health agencies licensed by the Department of Health and Senior Services and health care service firms, employment agencies or registries, and temporary help service firms or personnel consultants regulated by the Division of Consumer Affairs provide certain information about their employees' training to each patient or consumer receiving home-based services from that firm, agency, registry or consultant, or to a person designated by the patient or consumer.

Specifically, the information to be furnished would include:

- the name and certification or licensure title, as applicable, of a homemaker-home health aide or other health care professional regulated pursuant to Title 45 of the Revised Statutes, who is employed by a home health agency or health care service firm, to be displayed on an identification tag that the homemaker-home health aide or other health care professional is to wear at all times while examining, observing or caring for the patient (and which, beginning on the first day of the 13th month after the date of enactment of this substitute, would be required to include a photograph of the homemaker-home health aide or other health care professional);
- C in the case of a home health agency or health care service firm, a copy of the most current edition of the consumer guide to homemaker-home health aides published by the New Jersey Board of Nursing; and
- c with respect to the qualifications of each service provider who is not a certified homemaker-home health aide or other health care professional regulated pursuant to Title 45 of the Revised Statutes:
  - -- notification that the person is not a certified homemakerhome health aide or other regulated health care professional;
  - -- any training received by that person which the employing

entity deems relevant to the provision of the services that the person is assigned to provide;

- -- proof that the person is a United States citizen or legally documented alien; and
- -- evidence of employment history verification or character references for that person.

The purpose of this substitute is to ensure that home health care patients and their families receive basic information in advance about the qualifications of the persons responsible for their care from the employers of those persons.

This substitute is identical to the Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 701 (SCA) (Weinberg/Vandervalk), which the Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee also reported on this date.

#### McGreevey Signs Legislation to Protect Patients Receiving Home Health Care

(TRENTON)—Governor James E. McGreevey signed into law today Assembly Bill 701, which requires home health agencies and home care service firms to provide patients with information about their employees in advance of, or at the time of, their initial visit.

"Each and every day, thousands of families throughout New Jersey rely on the valuable and essential services provided by home health care professionals," said McGreevey. "With this new law requiring that home health aides provide patients with information on their training and background, families can feel even more confident that their loved ones will be in good hands. I would like to recognize Assemblywoman Loretta Weinberg, as well as the other legislative sponsors, for their leadership and efforts in making sure this important piece of legislation became law."

Assemblywomen Loretta Weinberg (D-Bergen) and Charlotte Vandervalk (R-Bergen) sponsored A-701. The Senate version of the bill, S-499, was sponsored by Senators Joseph Vitale (D-Middlesex) and John Adler (D-Camden). The legislation passed both houses unanimously.

"Better scrutiny of home health care workers will ensure that patients are receiving the full measure of services they need and deserve," said Weinberg. "Ill trained or unqualified individuals should not be posing as home health providers who may be called upon to make crucial emergency decisions that could make the difference between life and death."

The law was initiated by a constituent in Assemblywoman Weinberg's district who was unable to obtain accurate or complete information about the qualifications or abilities of several of the attendants that home health service providers sent to her home to care for their developmentally disabled daughter.

Specifically, the law states that whenever caring for a patient, home health care professionals must wear identification tags containing their name and title, and eventually a photograph. In addition, the law requires that patients receive a copy of the most current edition of the "Consumer Guide to Homemaker-Home Health Aides" published by the New Jersey Board of Nursing.

Furthermore, any health care service firm or other employment agency that is regulated by the Division of Consumer Affairs that employ an uncertified or unregulated home health care professional must provide patients, in writing, with information on the home health care professional's training.

Each patient must be provided, in writing, with notification that the person providing services is not a certified or regulated home health care professional; information about training; proof that the person is a U.S. citizen or legally documented alien; and evidence of employment history and/ or character references.
