The department shall issue to each local registrar and to 9 city clerks of cities of the first class, the form and substance of the 10 several inquiries to be made of applicants for a marriage license and 11 their witnesses for the purpose of ascertaining whether any legal 12 impediment to any proposed marriage exists.
- The form shall not contain any inquiries or information which concerns the race of an applicant for a marriage license.
