Each institution shall use 13 the grants for existing renewal and renovations needs at instructional, 14 15 laboratory, communication, research, and administrative facilities. An institution may use up to [5%] 20% of a grant within student-support 16 facilities for [fire code renovations, health-safety code renovations and 17 18 other State and federal code-related renovations] renewal and 19 renovation or improvement, expansion, construction, and reconstruction. If all [such] renewal and renovation is completed at 20 instructional, laboratory, communication, research, and administrative 21 22 facilities or is accounted for through other funding sources, or if an 23 institution is granted an exemption by the Commission on Higher 24 Education for the purpose of maximizing federal grant fund recoveries 25 or for the purpose of replacing a building when projected renewal and 26 renovation costs exceed the projected cost of replacement, then grant 27 funds may be used for the improvement, expansion, construction, and 28 reconstruction of instructional, laboratory, communication, and 29 research facilities, or technology infrastructure. 30 As used in this act: 31 "renewal and renovation" means making the changes necessary to 32 address deferred capital maintenance needs, to meet all State and federal health, safety, fire, and building code standards, or to provide 33 34 a safe and appropriate educational or working environment; 35 "student-support facilities" mean student resident halls, student 36 dining facilities, student activity centers, and student health centers; 37 and 38 "technology infrastructure" means video, voice, and data 39 telecommunications equipment and linkages with a life expectancy of 40 at least 10 years. 41 (cf: P.L.1999, c.217, s.4)

Currently under the act, an institution of higher education may use up to 5% of a grant award within student-support facilities for fire code renovations, health and safety code renovations, and other State and federal code-related renovations. This bill authorizes an institution of higher education to use up to 20% of a grant award within student-support facilities. It also replaces the current description of permissible uses of grant funds expended on these facilities with a broader description comprising any "renewal and renovation or improvement, expansion, construction, and reconstruction."

As reported, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2637 as also reported by the committee.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This bill has not been certified as requiring a fiscal note. An institution of higher education may utilize more of its grant award for student-support facilities.
