The Assembly Health and Human Services Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 908.

This bill requires nursing homes in New Jersey to have a defibrillator on site and employees who are trained to use the defibrillator.

Specifically, the bill provides that, no later than one year after its effective date, a nursing home must:

- -- acquire at least one defibrillator as defined in N.J.S.A.2A:62A-24, which is to be maintained in a central location within the nursing home that will be made known and available to the employees of the nursing home for the purposes of this bill;
- -- ensure that the defibrillator is tested and maintained, and provide notification to the appropriate first aid, ambulance or rescue squad or other appropriate emergency medical services provider regarding the defibrillator, the type acquired and its location, pursuant to N.J.S.A.2A:62A-25;
- -- arrange and pay for training in cardio-pulmonary resuscitation and the use of a defibrillator for employees of the nursing home in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A.2A:62A-25; and
- -- ensure that the employees of the nursing home comply with the provisions of N.J.S.A.2A:62A-26 concerning the use of the defibrillator.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2131 (1R) of 2002 (Diegnan/Barnes), which this committee reported during the prior session. The bill was pending before the General Assembly at the conclusion of the 210th Legislature.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 2004-2005 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
