1 AN ACT concerning absentee ballots and amending P.L.1953, c.211.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 6 1. Section 2 of P.L.1953, c.211 (C.19:57-2) is amended to read as 7 follows:
 - 2. Whenever used in this act, the following terms shall, unless the context indicates otherwise, be construed to have the following meanings:

10 "Absentee ballot" means any military service ballot or civilian absentee ballot as herein defined.

"Absentee voter" means any person qualified to vote a military service ballot or a civilian absentee ballot under the provisions of this act.

"Armed Forces of the United States" means any branch or department of the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard or Marine Corps.

"Civilian absentee ballot" means a ballot for use by a civilian absentee voter as prescribed by this act.

"Civilian absentee voter" means any qualified and registered voter of the State who [expects to be absent from the State on the day of any election and any qualified and registered voter who will be within the State on the day of any election but because of illness or physical disability, including blindness or pregnancy, or because of the observance of a religious holiday pursuant to the tenets of his religion, or because of resident attendance at a school, college or university, or because of the nature and hours of his employment, will be unable to cast his ballot at the polling place in his election district on the day of the election] wants to vote by absentee ballot.

"Election," "general election," "primary election for the general election," "municipal election," "school election," and "special election" shall mean, respectively, such elections as defined in the Title to which this is a supplement (R.S.19:1-1 et seq.).

"Family member" means an adult who is a spouse, parent, child, grandparent, grandchild or sibling of a voter, whether by adoption or natural relationship. It shall also include any adult occupant regularly living with a voter in any residential building or part of a building intended for the use of no more than one family.

"Incapacitated absentee voter" means a voter who, due to incapacity, is unable to complete his ballot.

EXPLANATION - Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter underlined thus is new matter.

Matter enclosed in superscript numerals has been adopted as follows:

"Military service" means active service by any person, as a member of any branch or department of the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard or Marine Corps, or as a member of the maritime or merchant marine service, or as a reservist [absent from his place of residence and] undergoing training under Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard or Marine Corps direction[, at a place other than that of such person's residence].

"Military service voter" means a qualified elector under the Constitution and the laws of this State who comes within one of the following categories:

- (a) Persons in the military service and their spouses and dependents.
- (b) Patients in a veterans' hospital [located in any place other than the place of their residences] who have been in the military service in any war in which the United States has been engaged and have been discharged or released from such service.
- (c) Civilians attached to or serving with the Armed Forces of the United States [without this State] and their spouses and dependents when residing with or accompanying them.

"Military service ballot" means a ballot for use by a military service voter as prescribed by this act.

"Member of the maritime or merchant marine service" means any person employed as an officer or crew member of a vessel documented under the laws of the United States, or a vessel owned by the United States, or a vessel of foreign-flag registry under charter to or control of the United States or enrolled with the United States for employment or training for employment, or maintained by the United States for emergency relief service as an officer or crew member of any such vessel or any such person as otherwise defined in section 107 of Pub.L.99-410, the "Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act," (42 U.S.C. 1973ff-6).

33 2. Section 3 of P.L.1953, c.211 (C.19:57-3) is amended to read as follows:

3. The following persons shall be entitled to vote by absentee ballot in any election to be held in this State, in the manner hereinafter provided:

A military service voter who [may be absent on the day on which such election is held from the election district in which he resides, whether such person is within or without this State in the case of a military service voter as defined in paragraph (a) or (b) of section 2, or without this State and within or without the United States in the case of any military service voter as defined in section 2, provided he] has resided in this State at least 30 days and in the county in which he claims the right to vote at least 30 days counting the time he has been absent from the election district in which he resides because of the service, work,

status or relationship entitling him to a military service ballot;

A military service voter who is stationed and resident in any garrison, barrack or military or naval place or station within this State, or who resides therein as spouse or dependent of a person in the military, naval or marine service so stationed, and who claims his vote in the municipality wherein such residence is located, shall be entitled to vote by military absentee ballot in any election for which he is duly registered to cast his vote in the election district of his residence in said municipality, but not otherwise; and

A civilian absentee voter [who expects to be or may be absent outside the State or the United States on the day on which an election is held or who may be within the State on the day of any election but because of permanent and total disability, or because of illness or temporary physical disability, or because of the observance of a religious holiday pursuant to the tenets of his religion, or because of resident attendance at a school, college or university, or because of the nature and hours of his employment, will be unable to cast his ballot at the polling place in his election district on the day of the election, provided he is a registered voter, and is not otherwise disqualified by law from voting in such election] as defined in section 2 of P.L.1953, c.211 (C.19:57-2).

This act shall be liberally construed to effectuate these purposes. (cf: P.L.1977, c.47, s.2)

- 3. Section 4 of P.L.1953, c.211 (C.19:57-4) is amended to read as follows:
- 4. At any time not less than seven days prior to an election in which he desires to vote by mail, a civilian absentee voter may apply to the person designated in section 6 of P.L.1953, c.211 (C.19:57-6), for a civilian absentee ballot. Such application or request shall be made in writing, shall be signed by the applicant and shall state his or her place of voting residence and the address to which said ballot shall be sent [, and the reason for which the ballot is requested].

Any military service voter desiring to vote in any election or any relative or friend of a military service voter who believes that such voter will desire to vote in any election, may apply to the person designated in section 6 of P.L.1953, c.211 (C.19:57-6) for a military service ballot to be sent to such voter. A military service voter may use a federal postcard application form to apply for a military service ballot. On any application made by a military service voter the voter may request a military service ballot for all subsequent elections through and including the next two regularly scheduled general elections for federal office which take place after the request is made; if such a request is made, a military service ballot shall be sent in a timely manner to the voter for all such elections.

Any civilian absentee voter who fails to apply within the seven-day time prescribed above may apply in person to the county clerk for an absentee ballot on any day up to 3 p.m. of the day before the election.

1 In the event of sickness or confinement, the qualified voter may 2 apply in writing for and obtain an absentee ballot by authorized 3 messenger, who shall be so designated over the signature of the voter and 4 whose printed name and address shall appear on the application in the space provided. The authorized messenger shall be a family member or 5 6 a registered voter of the county in which the application is made and shall 7 place his signature on the application in the space so provided in the 8 presence of the county clerk or his designee. No person who is a 9 candidate in the election for which the voter requests an absentee ballot 10 shall be permitted to serve as an authorized messenger. The authorized 11 messenger shall show a photo identification card to the county clerk, or 12 the designee thereof, at the time the messenger submits the application 13 form. The county clerk or his designee shall authenticate the signature of 14 the authorized messenger, in the event such a messenger is other than a 15 family member, by comparing it with the signature of the said person appearing on a State of New Jersey driver's license, or other identification 16 17 issued or recognized as official by the federal government, the State, or 18 any of its political subdivisions, which identification carries the full address 19 and signature of said person. After the signature of the application and, 20 when appropriate, authentication, the county clerk or his designee is 21 authorized to deliver to the authorized messenger a ballot to be delivered 22 to the qualified voter. The Attorney General shall cause to be prepared 23 a standard authorized messenger application form, which may be included 24 with the standard civilian absentee ballot application forms. 25 authorized messenger section of the application shall contain the following 26 language above the signature of the authorized messenger: "I do hereby 27 certify that I will deliver the absentee ballot directly to the voter and no 28 other person, under penalty of law." 29

A voter who is permanently and totally disabled ¹, and any other voter who wishes to vote only by absentee ballot in a general election¹, and who states [the reason for such disability in] that on a request for an absentee ballot, shall be furnished an application for an absentee ballot by the county clerk for ¹[all] ¹ future elections in which the voter shall be eligible to vote, without further request on the part of the voter ¹and until the voter requests that he or she no longer be sent an application¹. A voter who is permanently and totally disabled shall have the option to indicate on an application for an absentee ballot that the voter would like to receive an absentee ballot for each election that takes place during the remainder of the calendar year in which the application is completed and submitted. A voter who exercises this option shall be furnished with an absentee ballot for each election that takes place during the remainder of the calendar year without further request by the voter. A person voting by absentee ballot who registered by mail after January 1, 2003, who did not provide personal identification information when registering pursuant to section 16 of P.L.1974, c.30 (C.19:31-6.4) and is voting for the first time in his or her current county of residence following registration shall

- of P.L.1953, c.211 (C.19:57-2), and overseas federal election voter
- 12 ballots, as provided for in P.L.1976, c.23 (C.19:59-1 et seq.). The

- 14 applications, military service ballot applications and overseas federal
- 15 election voter registration and ballot applications to any military service

Voters who are permanently and totally disabled ¹, and any other voters who wish to vote only by absentee ballot in a general election, and who state that on their request shall, after their initial request and without further action on their part, be forwarded an absentee ballot application by the county clerk for ¹[all] ¹ future elections in which they are eligible to vote ¹and until the voter requests that he or she no longer be sent an <u>application</u>¹. Permanently and totally disabled voters also have the option of indicating on their absentee ballot applications that they would prefer to receive absentee ballots for each election that takes place during the remainder of this calendar year. Permanently and totally disabled voters who exercise this option will be furnished with absentee ballots for each election that takes place during the remainder of this calendar year, without further action on their part.

The Attorney General is authorized to make such necessary changes to the instructions for absentee ballot materials as the Attorney General deems necessary or as is mandated by federal or State law.

4 The inner envelope shall be so designed that it can be sealed after the 5 absentee ballot has been placed therein and the flap thereof shall be of such length and size as to leave sufficient margin, after sealing, for the 6 printing thereon of the certificate hereinafter described. The flap shall be 7 8 so arranged that, after the inner envelope has been sealed, the certificate 9 can be contained, with the said inner envelope, in the outer envelope, and 10 that the margin containing the certificate can be detached without 11 unsealing the inner envelope.

On the outside of each envelope in which an absentee ballot is sent to an absentee voter by the county clerk, there shall be printed or stamped the words "Official Military Service Ballot" or "Official Civilian Absentee Ballot" as the case may be. In addition, there shall be printed or stamped the following:

17 To protect your vote:

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18 IT IS AGAINST THE LAW FOR ANYONE EXCEPT YOU THE 19 VOTER TO OPEN, MARK, INSPECT OR SEAL THIS BALLOT.

However, a family member may assist you in doing so. If you are an incapacitated absentee voter, a person other than a family member may also assist you in doing so.

The reverse side of each inner envelope shall contain the following statement:

ANY PERSON MAY BE FINED AND IMPRISONED AND MAY
ALSO LOSE THE RIGHT TO VOTE UNTIL RESTORED BY LAW if
he attempts to vote fraudulently by absentee ballot, prevents the voting of
a legal voter, certifies falsely any information, interferes with a person's
secrecy of voting, tampers with ballots or election documents or helps
another person to do so.

33 8. Section 23 of P.L.1953, c.211 (C.19:57-23) is amended to read as 34 follows:

35 23. Any absentee voter shall be entitled to mark any absentee ballot, so forwarded to him, for voting at any election by indicating his choice of 36 37 candidates for the offices named, and as to public questions, if any, stated 38 thereon, in accordance with the election laws of this State, except that in 39 such ballots to be voted in any primary election for the general election his 40 choice shall be limited to the candidates of his political party or to any 41 person or persons whose names are written thereon by him. When so marked, such ballot shall be placed in said inner envelope, which shall then 42 be sealed, and the voter shall then fill in the form of certificate attached to 43 44 said inner envelope, at the end of which he shall sign and print his name 45 in his own handwriting. The inner envelope with the certificate shall then 46 be placed in said outer envelope, which shall then be sealed. No person

This Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 35 permits any registered voter who wishes to vote by absentee ballot to do so without being required to provide a reason for not being able to vote in person on the day of an election.

Under current law, an absentee ballot is available to a qualified and registered voter who expects to be absent from the State on the day of any election or who will be within the State on the day of any election but because of illness or physical disability, including blindness or pregnancy, or because of the observance of a religious holiday, or because of resident attendance at a school, college or university, or because of the nature and hours of employment, will be unable to cast a ballot at the polling place in the appropriate election district on the day of the election.

The substitute also provides that: 1) no person who is a candidate in the election for which the voter requests an absentee ballot will be permitted to assist in the completion of the ballot or serve as an authorized messenger; 2) whenever the county clerk forwards by mail a military or civilian absentee ballot, as the case may be, to an absentee ballot voter between the 14th day and the fourth day prior to the day of an election, the ballot must be transmitted, following approval of the application, within two business days of the receipt of the application; 3) the clerk must prepare one list of requests for absentee ballots and another list of the applicants whose applications were approved and who were sent absentee ballots and the lists must be updated each business day, made available to the public and transmitted to elections officials; 4) each county board of elections must compile a list of the name and street address of each person who has completed and returned a voted civilian or military absentee ballot and the name and street address of each person who has delivered such a ballot personally to the board. The board must update the list each business day, make it available to the public and transmit it to elections officials.

FISCAL IMPACT:

In the fiscal estimate, it was noted that there may be increased costs for additional voters utilizing absentee ballots but the number is indeterminable. Plus, there may be additional activity in faxing, mailing and processing absentee ballots at the county level.

The Senate State Government Committee reports favorably a Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Nos. 1133, 1435 and 2397.

This substitute permits any registered voter who wishes to vote by absentee ballot to do so without being required to provide a reason for not being able to vote in person on the day of an election.

Under current law, an absentee ballot is available to a qualified and registered voter who expects to be absent from the State on the day of any election or who will be within the State on the day of any election but because of illness or physical disability, including blindness or pregnancy, or because of the observance of a religious holiday, or because of resident attendance at a school, college or university, or because of the nature and hours of employment, will be unable to cast a ballot at the polling place in the appropriate election district on the day of the election.

The substitute also provides that: 1) no person who is a candidate in the election for which the voter requests an absentee ballot will be permitted to assist in the completion of the ballot or serve as an authorized messenger; 2) whenever the county clerk forwards by mail a military or civilian absentee ballot, as the case may be, to an absentee ballot voter between the 14th day and the fourth day prior to the day of an election, the ballot must be transmitted, following approval of the application, within two business days of the receipt of the application; 3) the clerk must prepare one list of requests for absentee ballots and another list of the applicants whose applications were approved and sent absentee ballots and the lists must be updated each business day, made available to the public and transmitted to elections officials; and 4) each county board of elections must compile a list of the name and street address of each person who has completed and returned a voted civilian or military absentee ballot and the name and street address of each person who has delivered such a ballot personally to the board. The board must update the list each business day, make it available to the public and transmit it to elections officials.

This substitute is identical to Assembly, No. 35 ACS.

STATEMENT TO

SENATE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE Nos. 1133, 1435 and 2397

with Senate Floor Amendments (Proposed By Senator SMITH)

ADOPTED: JUNE 23, 2005

This Senate amendment provides that any voter who wishes to vote only by absentee ballot in a general election will be sent an application for such a ballot automatically for such elections in which the voter will be eligible to vote after his or her first request, without further request and until the voter requests that he or she no longer be sent such an application.

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) recognizes that this bill would expand the number of New Jersey residents who would be able to file for an absentee ballot. The OLS notes that it is impossible to determine how many residents would take advantage of this option on election day.

As a result, OLS notes that it cannot determine the cost to the counties of faxing, mailing or processing the absentee requests and ballots. The counties may need extra staff and/or equipment depending on the possible increase in absentee ballots.

Codey Signs Bills to Expand Voter Access, Improve Electoral Process

Bills will Move up the Date of New Jersey's Presidential Primary; Allow More Time to Register; Allow Anyone to Vote by Absentee Ballot; Require a Paper Ballot with all Votes Cast Electronically

(TRENTON) –Acting Governor Richard J. Codey today signed into law a package of bills that will improve the electoral process in New Jersey by expanding voter access and moving the state's presidential primary to the last Tuesday in February.

"Over the past eight months we have made reforms to restore accountability to state government, driven by the belief that government cannot function without the public's trust," Codey said. "But improving the integrity of government also requires that we strengthen the electoral process itself."

"Today we are achieving the goals I set out in the State of the State address: to improve every New Jerseyan's access, to make sure people have confidence in the voting system, and to make sure New Jersey's votes actually mean something in the presidential primaries," Codey said.

Codey signed the four bills during a public ceremony at the Governor's Outer Office, in the State House. He was joined by bill sponsors including Senator Nia H. Gill (D-Essex, Passaic) and Assembly Majority Leader Joseph J. Roberts (D-Camden, Gloucester).

The four bills are:

A30/S550, which moves the presidential primary to the last Tuesday in February. The bill's sponsors include Senate President Codey as well as Senators Joseph F. Vitale (D-Middlesex), John H. Adler (D-Camden) and Wayne R. Bryant (D-Camden, Gloucester), and Assembly members Linda R. Greenstein (D-Mercer, Middlesex), Richard A. Merkt (R-Morris), Robert M. Gordon (D-Bergen), John F. McKeon (D-Essex) and Mims Hackett (D-Essex).

A 42 / S2387, which permits voter registration up to 21 days, instead of the previous 29 days, before an election. The bill's sponsors include Senator Wayne R. Bryant (D-Camden, Gloucester) as well as Assembly members Bonnie Watson Coleman (D-Mercer), Gerald B. Green (D-Middlesex, Somerset, Union), Jack Conners (D-Burlington, Camden) and Herb Conaway (D-Burlington, Camden).

A35 / S1133, which permits any registered voter to vote by absentee ballot if they so choose, without having to provide a reason for not being able to vote in person on the day of an election. The bill's sponsors include Senators Robert G. Smith (D-Middlesex, Somerset) and Stephen M. Sweeney (D-Cumberland, Gloucester, Salem), and Assembly members David R. Mayer (D-Camden, Gloucester), Joseph J. Roberts (D-Camden, Gloucester), John J. Burzichelli (D-Cumberland, Gloucester, Salem) and Loretta Weinberg (D-Bergen).

A33 / S29, which requires that voting machines produce a voter-verified paper record for each vote cast. The bill's sponsors include Senators Nia H. Gill (D-Essex, Passaic), Shirley K. Turner (D-Mercer), Wayne R. Bryant (D-Camden, Gloucester), and Assembly members Reed Gusciora (D-Mercer), Peter C. Eagler (D-Essex, Passaic), Robert M. Gordon (D-Bergen) and Herb Conaway (D-Burlington, Camden).

Roberts said, "New Jersey's election laws are as out of date as the eight-track tape. These laws are the most ambitious changes to our election system since it was overhauled under Governor Woodrow Wilson nearly a century ago. These laws will promote access, accuracy and accountability in elections. They will strengthen the voting process and lend further credibility to future election results."

Turner said, "The American people have fought hard during our history to secure the right to vote for all adult citizens. When our constituents take the time to exercise this right, they deserve the assurance that their vote will be counted each and every time, without fail. It has become clear with the voting problems we have seen in other states, that we need to ensure that every vote is recorded on a piece of paper that can be verified by the voter before leaving the polling booth and can be manually counted by election officials if needed."

Vitale said, "The variety of issues that are debated during a Presidential campaign more closely mirror the interests that affect New Jerseyan's every day. New Jersey is in so many ways a microcosm reflecting the needs of the nation as a whole. In the next race to the presidency, candidates will need the support of the Garden State to cement their standing as either party's pick for the presidential nomination, if they are to truly represent the needs and wishes of the people."

Gill said, "As we move forward with more sophisticated methods of voting, we need to assure voters that their ballots are tamper-proof, and their votes will indeed be counted. A voter-verified paper trail, used in the event of a machine recount, will preserve the integrity of the voting process, and ensure that democracy does not become an unintended victim of the advance of technology."

Greenstein said, "The sad truth is that New Jersey has not been viewed by presidential candidates as fertile ground for growing support, but rather as a money tree to be shaken. New Jersey voters deserve the clout befitting a bellwether state. They deserve to have their voices heard when it comes to national politics."

Mayer said, "Voters should never have to lie about why they wish to vote by absentee ballot. Working parents whose hectic schedules may keep them from visiting the voting booth on Election Day and senior citizens who prefer filling out their ballots at the kitchen table should be given every ability to receive an absentee ballot with no questions asked."

Congressman Rush Holt also praised the reforms, saying, "Anything of value should be auditable, especially something as precious as a vote. I applaud your commitment to ensuring that the vote of each New Jerseyan is counted in a verifiable way. I look forward to continuing to work with you to ensure that the results of every election in the State of New Jersey are verifiable and auditable."
