1 AN ACT concerning recounts following elections and amending
2 R.S.19:28-1.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. R.S.19:28-1 is amended to read as follows:

8 19:28-1. When any candidate at any election shall have reason to
9 believe that an error has been made [by any district board or any board
10 of canvassers] in counting the [vote or declaring the vote] votes of
11 [any] that election, [he] the candidate may, [on or before the second
12 Saturday] within a period of 15 days following such election[, or
13 declaration of any board of canvassers] , apply to a judge of the
14 Superior Court assigned to the county wherein such district or districts
15 are located, for a recount of the votes cast at the election in any
16 district or districts.

17 When ten voters at any election shall have reason to believe that an
18 error has been so made in counting [or declaring] the [vote] votes
19 upon any public question at any election, such voters may, within a
20 [like time, make like application for a like] period of 15 days
21 following such election, apply to a judge of the Superior Court
22 assigned to the county wherein such district or districts are located,
23 for a recount of the votes cast at the election in any district or
24 districts on such public question.

27 2. This act shall take effect immediately, unless that date falls
28 within 30 days before an election, in which case this act shall take
29 effect on the 30th day following that election.

33 The purpose of this bill is to alter the time allotted to file an
34 application with a judge of the Superior Court for a recount of voting
35 machines. Currently, that period of time can be on or before the
36 second Saturday following the election or the declaration of the vote
37 by any board of canvassers. The bill sets the time at within 15 days
38 following the election.

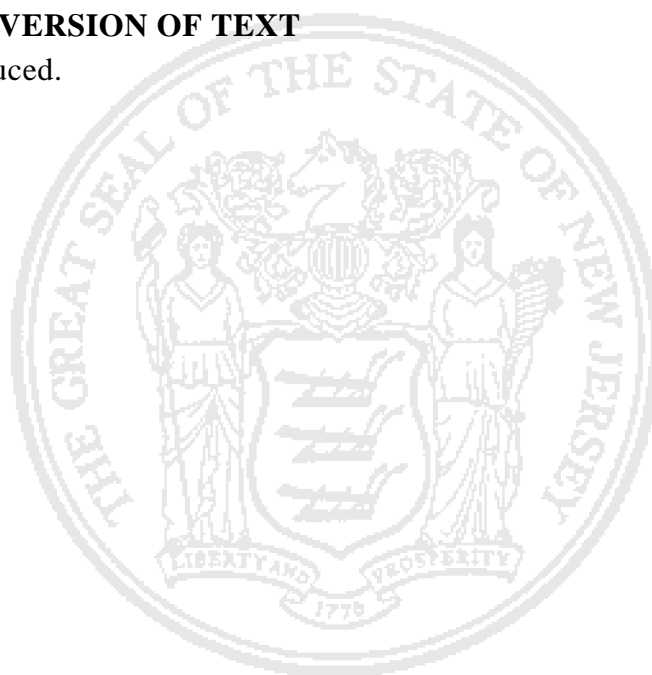
