The Senate State Government Committee reports favorably a Senate Committee Substitute for Senate, Nos. 976 and 2395.

This substitute provides that following each election, the county board of elections in every county will prepare reports listing the number of emergency ballots and provisional ballots used in the election, including any spoiled, void, or invalid emergency or provisional ballots. Each report will list the number of such ballots by election district and include a county-wide total. The reports will be available for public inspection and copying.

As reported, this is identical to Assembly No. 37.
