The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2477.

This bill changes the criteria for continued receipt of a scholarship under the NJ STARS Program after the student's first year of enrollment in a county college.

The New Jersey Student Tuition Assistance Rewarded Scholarship Program (NJ STARS) was established in 2005 under P.L.2004, c.59. The program, administered by the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority (HESAA), provides that subject to the prior application of other grants and scholarships against the cost of county college tuition and fees, a student who graduated in the top 20 percent of the student's high school graduating class will be eligible for a scholarship for the first year of enrollment on a full-time basis in a county college. The current law provides that after that student's first year of enrollment, the scholarship will be payable if the student was ranked in the top 20 percent of all first-time students enrolled in a fulltime course of study at the county college during the student's initial year of enrollment.

This bill changes that top 20 percent county college first year ranking criteria for continuation of that scholarship in the second year of enrollment. Instead the first year student - scholarship recipient will have to attain at least a 3.0 grade point average (GPA) by the start of the student's second year of enrollment in order to continue receiving the scholarship. If an NJ STARS scholarship student has less than a 3.0 GPA at the start of the second semester of the first year, the student will be required to participate in an enrichment program during the second semester of that first year.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

The change in criteria for second year receipt of an NJ STARS Scholarship may increase the number of first year NJ STARS recipients that will be eligible for the award in their second year. The New Jersey Council of County Colleges has indicated that of the FY 2005 freshman cohort of scholarship recipients, the number of NJ STARS students ranking in the top 20 percent of their freshman class and eligible to continue receiving the award in their second year of county college enrollment is 44 percent of 1,126 NJ STARS students, or 495 students. If the second year award criteria is changed to a first year grade point average of 3.0, continued eligibility would be extended to 60 percent of the 1,126 NJ STARS students, or 675 second-year students, an additional 180 students.

Given the requirement that recipients must continue to apply for all other available forms of federal and State need-based grants and merit scholarships, it is difficult to quantify how the change will impact actual program costs in FY 2006 and future years. However, if 60 percent of the first cohort of NJ STARS students receive an NJ STARS scholarship in their second year of enrollment which fully funds tuition and fee expenses at a New Jersey county college, the cost to fund the estimated 675 second-year recipients at the 2004-2005 average county college tuition and fee cost of \$2,771 would be \$1.9 million dollars in FY 2006. If the criteria is not changed and 44 percent of 1,126 NJ STARS students, or 495 students, are awarded an NJ STARS scholarship which fully funds tuition and fee expenses in their second year of county college enrollment, the cost would be \$1.4 million dollars in FY 2006. The maximum cost for the additional 180 students could approximate \$500,000 in FY2006, which amount would be reduced by any federal and State need-based grants or merit scholarships that may be available to these students. The funding for an estimated 2,000 new first year students who are expected to enroll at a New Jersey county college under the NJ STARS Program in FY 2006 is not effected by this bill.

This bill changes the top 20 percent in the first year criteria to a requirement that the student will have to attain at least a 3.0 grade point average (GPA) by the start of the student's second year of enrollment in order to continue receiving the scholarship. If a scholarship recipient has less than a 3.0 GPA at the start of the second semester of the first year, the student will be required to participate in an enrichment program during the second semester of the initial year of enrollment.

The Office of Legislative Services has determined that it is not possible to accurately estimate the fiscal impact of this bill. The change in criteria for second year receipt of a NJ STARS scholarship may increase the number of first year NJ STARS scholarship recipients that will be eligible for the award in their second year. The New Jersey Council of County Colleges has indicated that of the FY 2005 freshman cohort of scholarship recipients, the number of NJ STARS scholarship students ranking in the top 20 percent of their freshman class and eligible to continue receiving the award in their second year of county college enrollment is 44 percent of 1,126 NJ STARS scholarship students, or 495 students. If the second year award criteria is changed to a first year grade point average of 3.0, continued eligibility would be extended to 60 percent of the 1,126 NJ STARS scholarship students, or 675 second-year students, an additional 180 students. Given the requirement that recipients must continue to apply for all other available forms of federal and State need-based grants and merit scholarships, it is difficult to quantify how the change will impact actual program costs in FY 2006 and future years. However, if 60 percent of the first cohort of NJ STARS scholarship students receive a NJ STARS scholarship in their second year of enrollment which fully funds tuition and fee expenses at a New Jersey county college, the cost to fund the estimated 675 second-year recipients at the 2004-2005 average county college tuition and fee cost of \$2,771 would be \$1.9 million dollars in FY 2006. If the criteria is not changed and 44 percent of 1,126 NJ STARS scholarship students, or 495 students, are awarded a NJ STARS scholarship which fully funds tuition and fee expenses in their second year of county college enrollment, the cost would be \$1.4 million dollars in FY 2006. The estimated amounts would not include funding for an estimated 2,000 new students who are expected to enroll at a New Jersey county college under the NJ STARS scholarship Program in FY 2006.

The Assembly Budget Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 4115.

Assembly Bill No. 4115 changes the criteria for continued receipt of a scholarship under the NJ STARS Program after the student's first year of enrollment in a county college.

The New Jersey Student Tuition Assistance Rewarded Scholarship Program (NJ STARS) was established in 2005 under P.L.2004, c.59. The program, administered by the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority (HESAA), provides that subject to the prior application of other grants and scholarships against the cost of county college tuition and fees, a student who graduated in the top 20 percent of the student's high school graduating class will be eligible for a scholarship for the first year of enrollment on a full-time basis in a county college. The current law provides that after that student's first year of enrollment, the scholarship will be payable if the student was ranked in the top 20 percent of all first-time students enrolled in a fulltime course of study at the county college during the student's initial year of enrollment.

This bill changes that top 20 percent county college first year ranking criteria for continuation of that scholarship in the second year of enrollment. Instead the first year student - scholarship recipient will have to attain at least a 3.0 grade point average (GPA) by the start of the student's second year of enrollment in order to continue receiving the scholarship. If an NJ STARS scholarship student has less than a 3.0 GPA at the start of the second semester of the first year, the student will be required to participate in an enrichment program during the second semester of that first year.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

The change in criteria for second year receipt of an NJ STARS Scholarship may increase the number of first year NJ STARS recipients that will be eligible for the award in their second year. The New Jersey Council of County Colleges has indicated that of the FY 2005 freshman cohort of scholarship recipients, the number of NJ STARS students ranking in the top 20 percent of their freshman class and eligible to continue receiving the award in their second year of county college enrollment is 44 percent of 1,126 NJ STARS students, or 495 students. If the second year award criteria is changed to a first year grade point average of 3.0, continued eligibility would be extended to 60 percent of the 1,126 NJ STARS students, or 675 second-year students, an additional 180 students.

Given the requirement that recipients must continue to apply for all other available forms of federal and State need-based grants and merit scholarships, it is difficult to quantify how the change will impact actual program costs in FY 2006 and future years. However, if 60 percent of the first cohort of NJ STARS students receive an NJ STARS scholarship in their second year of enrollment which fully funds tuition and fee expenses at a New Jersey county college, the cost to fund the estimated 675 second-year recipients at the 2004-2005 average county college tuition and fee cost of \$2,771 would be \$1.9 million dollars in FY 2006. If the criteria is not changed and 44 percent of 1,126 NJ STARS students, or 495 students, are awarded an NJ STARS scholarship which fully funds tuition and fee expenses in their second year of county college enrollment, the cost would be \$1.4 million dollars in FY 2006. The maximum cost for the additional 180 students could approximate \$500,000 in FY2006, which amount would be reduced by any federal and State need-based grants or merit scholarships that may be available to these students. The funding for an estimated 2,000 new first year students who are expected to enroll at a New Jersey county college under the NJ STARS Program in FY 2006 is not effected by this bill.

Under current law, for continued receipt of the scholarship in the second year of county college enrollment, the student must be ranked in the top 20 percent of all first-time students enrolled in a full-time course of study during the student's initial year of enrollment. This bill changes the top 20 percent in the first year criteria to a requirement that the student will have to attain at least a 3.0 grade point average by the start of the student's second year of enrollment in order to continue receiving the scholarship. If a scholarship recipient has less than a 3.0 grade point average at the start of the second semester of the first year, the student will be required to participate in an enrichment program during the second semester of the initial year of enrollment.
