The Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 543 (2R).

Senate Bill No. 543 (2R) permits an active member in good standing of a volunteer Office of Emergency Management to display blue emergency warning lights on a motor vehicle if the member's official duties include responding to a fire or emergency call and the member has an identification card prepared by the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission that authorizes the display and operation of emergency warning lights.

The bill states that members of a county volunteer Office of Emergency Management must submit an application for a permit to the County Emergency Management Coordinator. Members of a municipal volunteer Office of Emergency Management must submit an application to the Municipal Emergency Management coordinator.

As reported by the committee, Senate Bill No. 543 (2R) is identical to the Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill Nos. 3271 and 1659, also reported by the committee on this same day.

The Senate Law and Public Safety and Veterans' Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 543.

This bill permits an active member in good standing of a volunteer Office of Emergency Management to display blue emergency warning lights on a motor vehicle if the member's official duties include responding to a fire or emergency call and the member has an identification card prepared by the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission that authorizes the display and operation of emergency warning lights. This bill also establishes the procedures for applying for and approving such permits. Currently, only members of volunteer fire companies and volunteer first aid or rescue squads are statutorily authorized to display and use such emergency lights.

Finally, the bill requires other vehicles to yield to vehicles displaying the blue lights authorized by this bill, as they would to other authorized emergency vehicles.

The amendments make technical changes to the bill that could not be made as part of the technical review process. The amendments update references to the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2004 legislative session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

This bill permits an active member in good standing of a volunteer Office of Emergency Management to display blue emergency warning lights on a motor vehicle if the member's official duties include responding to a fire or emergency call and the member has an identification card prepared by the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission that authorizes the display and operation of emergency warning lights. 5. This act shall take effect on the first day of the third month following enactment.

STATEMENT

This bill would permit duly authorized volunteer members of a county or municipal Office of Emergency Management to display blue emergency warning lights on a motor vehicle. Under the provisions of the bill, a volunteer member of an Office of Emergency Management authorized to display emergency warning lights would have to abide by the same rules regarding placement, design and use of emergency warning lights as are currently applicable to members of volunteer fire companies and volunteer first aid or rescue squads. A violation of the rules would result in revocation of the privilege to display the lights and a fine of not more than \$50.

To obtain a permit for emergency warning lights, a member would submit an application to the municipal or county Emergency Management Coordinator. The coordinator would verify that the volunteer's official duties require the volunteer to respond to fire or emergency calls and forward the completed application to the chief executive officer of the county or municipality. Upon approval, the chief executive officer would forward the application to the Chief Administrator of the Motor Vehicle Commission. The chief administrator would make the permit, sign it, and send it back to the requesting chief executive officer. The chief executive officer would

Nothing contained herein is intended to grant to any member of a volunteer fire company [or], a volunteer first aid or rescue squad or a volunteer Office of Emergency Management any privileges or exemptions denied to the drivers of other vehicles, and such members displaying emergency warning lights shall drive with due regard for the safety of all persons and shall obey all the traffic laws of this State, provided, however, that the drivers of non-emergency vehicles upon any highway shall yield the right of way to the vehicle of any member of a volunteer fire company [or], a volunteer first aid or rescue squad or a volunteer Office of Emergency Management displaying emergency warning lights in the same manner as is provided for authorized emergency vehicles pursuant to R.S.39:4-92.

The Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably an Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill Nos. 3271 and 1659.

The Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill Nos. 3271 and 1659 permits an active member in good standing of a volunteer Office of Emergency Management to display blue emergency warning lights on a motor vehicle if the member's official duties include responding to a fire or emergency call and the member has an identification card prepared by the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission that authorizes the display and operation of emergency warning lights.

The bill states that members of a county volunteer Office of Emergency Management must submit an application for a permit to the County Emergency Management Coordinator. Members of a municipal volunteer Office of Emergency Management must submit an application to the Municipal Emergency Management coordinator.

As reported by the committee, this Assembly Committee Substitute is identical to Senate Bill No. 543(2R), also reported by the committee on this same day.
