

The Senate Law and Public Safety and Veterans' Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 2206.

This bill would expand both the membership and mission of the Council on Armed Forces and Veterans' Affairs.

Currently, the council has 10 members, including four legislators, the Adjutant General of the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs, Chief Executive Officer and Secretary of the Commerce and Economic Growth Commission, and Commissioner of Labor, or their designees, and three public members.

As amended and reported by the committee, the membership of the council would increase from 10 to 22 members. Additional members include the following individuals, or their designees: the Commissioner of Education, Commissioner of Environmental Protection, Commissioner of Transportation, State Treasurer, Commissioner of Community Affairs, and the Chair of the New Jersey Commission on Higher Education. Additionally, six public members would be added to the council, bringing the total number of public members to nine. Of the nine public members, eight would be required to be representatives of the community and business support groups for New Jersey's military installations and the United States Coast Guard training center.

Additionally, the mission of the council would be expanded to include addressing quality of life issues for all military personnel and their dependents, increasing public awareness of military missions performed in New Jersey and the economic impact they have on this State, facilitating coordinated planning and expedited review of military and Coast Guard permits and other requests, minimizing encroachment around military installations, and required meetings with installation commanders to discuss how New Jersey can more effectively support military and Coast Guard installations in the State.

There are currently seven major military installations in the state: Fort Dix, Fort Monmouth, McGuire Air Force Base, Navy Lakehurst, Picatinny Arsenal, the 177th Fighter Group at Atlantic City, and the Coast Guard Installation at Cape May.

The committee amended the bill to retain legislators as members, increasing the membership of the council to 22 members. Under current law, two members of the Senate and two members of the Assembly are appointed to the council. The bill, as introduced, removed the legislative members from the council.

As amended and reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 3707.
