The Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1086.

As amended by the committee, this bill would increase the membership of all county boards of taxation. The membership of county boards of taxation that currently have three members would be increased to five members and the membership of county boards of taxation that currently have five members would be increased to seven members. The bill, as amended, would ensure that no more than three of the members of a five-member board and that no more than four members of a seven-member board would belong to the same political party.

County Boards of Taxation currently authorized a five-member board that would be increased to a seven-member board under this amendment include Bergen, Essex, Hudson, Middlesex, Union, Monmouth, and Ocean counties.

County Boards of Taxation currently authorized a three-member board that would be increased to a five-member board under this amendment include Camden, Passaic, Morris, Burlington, Mercer, Somerset, Gloucester, Cumberland, Sussex, Hunterdon, Warren, Salem, Atlantic, and Cape May counties.

As originally introduced, the bill would have increased membership of the Morris County Board of Taxation, the Passaic County Board of Taxation and the Camden County Board of Taxation from three members to five members. The committee amendments expand the scope of the bill to increase the membership of all county boards of taxation.

The Assembly Housing and Local Government Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2340.

This bill would increase the membership of the Atlantic, Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, Mercer, Morris, Passaic, and Somerset County Boards of Taxation from three members to five members. Current law, which limits the population of counties eligible to have a five member board of taxation to 510,000 persons (according to the latest federal decennial census), provides for a fivemember board only in Bergen, Essex, Hudson, Middlesex, Monmouth, Ocean, and Union counties. Increasing the membership of the tax board to five members in Atlantic County and in the remaining second class counties (counties with a population over 200,000, not bordering on the Atlantic Ocean) will result in increased efficiency in the handling of tax appeals in these populous counties.

with Assembly Floor Amendments (Proposed By Assemblymen ROBERTS, VAN DREW and VAS)

#### ADOPTED: JANUARY 24, 2005

These floor amendments make Assembly Bill No. 2340 identical to Senate Bill No. 1086 (1R). The bill, as amended, would increase the membership of all county boards of taxation. The membership of county boards of taxation that currently have three members would be increased to five members and the membership of county boards of taxation that currently have five members would be increased to seven members. The bill, as amended, would ensure that no more than three of the members of a five-member board and that no more than four members of a seven-member board would belong to the same political party.

County Boards of Taxation currently authorized a five-member board that would be increased to a seven-member board under this amendment include Bergen, Essex, Hudson, Middlesex, Union, Monmouth, and Ocean counties.

County Boards of Taxation currently authorized a three-member board that would be increased to a five-member board under this amendment include Camden, Passaic, Morris, Burlington, Mercer, Somerset, Gloucester, Cumberland, Sussex, Hunterdon, Warren, Salem, Atlantic, and Cape May counties.

As originally introduced, the bill would have increased membership of the Morris County Board of Taxation, the Passaic County Board of Taxation and the Camden County Board of Taxation from three members to five members. These floor amendments expand the scope of the bill to increase the membership of all county boards of taxation.

# **BILL DESCRIPTION**

Assembly Bill No. 2340 of 2004 would increase the membership of all county boards of taxation. The membership of county boards of taxation that currently have three members would be increased to five members and the membership of county boards of taxation that currently

The bill would ensure that no more than three of the members of a five-member board and that no more than four members of a seven-member board would belong to the same political party.

The county boards of taxation in Camden, Passaic, Morris, Burlington, Mercer, Somerset, Gloucester, Cumberland, Sussex, Hunterdon, Warren, Salem, Atlantic, and Cape May counties which are currently authorized as three-member boards would be increased to a five-member board under this bill.

The county boards of taxation of Bergen, Essex, Hudson, Middlesex, Union, Monmouth, and Ocean counties which are currently authorized as five-member boards would be increased to seven-member boards under this bill.

#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **EXECUTIVE BRANCH**

#### **OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES**

The OLS estimates the additional annual cost of this bill to the State to be approximately \$1,029,689. This estimate was derived by reviewing the most recent population of each county as determined by New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development pursuant to N.J.S.A.54:3-6, which provides for the annual salary of each board member depending on the population size of the county to be served. The OLS further modified the base salary estimate in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A54:3-6 by applying a fringe benefits cost ratio of 33.25 percent to the base salary in order to arrive at the final total compensation estimated cost to the State of \$1,029,689. The OLS notes that the FY 2005 appropriations act (P.L.2004, c.71) appropriated \$1.48 million for the salaries of county tax board members. Under this bill, this annual appropriation would increase by 70 percent to approximately \$2,510,689 (an increase of \$1,029,689) in order to cover the cost of employing two more members for each of the 21 county boards of taxation. The OLS observes that this increased cost would require the State to continue paying the annual salaries for all new county tax board members as well as the county tax board members currently authorized by law.
