

Safe Return is a national identification, support and registration program operating in conjunction with local law enforcement officials to safely recover lost individuals with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.

The bill provides that, at a minimum, the training protocols established by the Department of Law and Public Safety must include: * guidelines for identifying persons with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders;

* guidelines on communicating with persons with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders;

* guidelines for caring for persons with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders who become lost and disoriented; and

As amended and reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 2185, which also was amended and reported by the committee on this same date.

As amended and reported by the committee, this bill is identical to
