The Assembly Transportation Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 1607.

As reported, this amended bill amends R.S.39:3-25 to allow a farmer to operate his or her truck to carry or transport any farm products or farm supplies and to operate his or her truck under contract with a municipality to remove snow.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 2004-2005 session pending technical review which has been performed.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The bill as originally introduced provided that a farmer may operate his or her truck under any contract for snow removal, not just under contract with a municipality. The committee amended the bill to require that the contract to remove snow must be with a municipality. The committee also deleted any provisions relating to the operation of a farm truck as a commercial motor vehicle.

The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 592.

As reported, this amended bill amends R.S.39:3-25 to allow a farmer to operate a truck with "farmer" license plates to carry or transport any farm products and farm supplies and to operate the truck under contract with a municipality to remove snow.

The bill as originally introduced provided that a farmer may operate the truck under any contract for snow removal, not just under contract with a municipality. The committee amended the bill to require that the contract to remove snow must be with a municipality. The committee also deleted any provisions relating to the operation of a farm truck as a commercial motor vehicle.

With these amendments, this bill is identical to A-1607 (1R) of 2004.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2004-2005 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.
