This authority must be established prior to September 2005 to prevent New Jersey from becoming ineligible for federal Motor Carrier Safety Assistance (MCSAP) funding.

As amended, Assembly Bill No. 3773 is identical to Senate Bill No. 1989(1R) which released by committee today.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amended the bill to correct CFR citations in the bill's text.
