AN ACT concerning State school aid for certain school districts which are bordered by Abbott districts and supplementing P.L.1996, c.138 (C.18A:7F-1 et seq.).

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

Under the bill's provisions, additional State aid would be provided to school districts, other than regional or consolidated districts, which are bordered by three or more Abbott districts if the district meets one or more of the following criteria:

- (1) the district's per pupil cost in the prebudget year as reported in the Department of Education's Comparative Spending Guide was less than the average per pupil cost for the Abbott districts as calculated based on data from the Comparative Spending Guide;
- (2) the district had an average school student mobility rate of 10% or greater as reported in the most recent New Jersey School Report Card;
- (3) 35% or more of the district's students were eligible for free or reduced price meals under the federal school lunch program;

The factors ensure that the State aid will be "weighted" toward those districts with the greatest need. COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee amended the bill to:

- 1) provide that the bill's provisions will not apply to regional and consolidated school districts;
- 2) provide for the use of data compiled in the Department of Education's Comparative Spending Guide for the calculation of per pupil costs;
- 3) revise the language concerning the calculation of class size and student mobility rate to reflect the manner in which data is compiled in the New Jersey School Report Card;
- 4) adjust the cost factors used in the calculation of the amount of State aid allocated to eligible school districts; and
- 5) provide that an otherwise eligible school district will not receive State aid under the bill for the 2005-2006 school year unless the district received High Expectations for Learning Proficiency Aid in FY 2005. In subsequent school years, such a district will be eligible for the additional aid.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Office of Legislative Services has determined that five school districts qualify for the additional State aid under the bill: North Bergen, Bayonne, Clifton, Weehawken and Hillside. The additional State aid directed to these districts under current criteria will total approximately \$19,971,000.
