The committee also amended the bill's effective date.

As amended by the committee, Assembly Bill No. 4168 is identical to Senate Bill No. 2125 (1R) which also was reported by the committee on this same date.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee adopted the following amendments:

- 1) to require a law enforcement officer who responds to an offense involving criminal street gang activity to complete a gang related incident offense report and forward that report to the appropriate county bureau of identification and to the Superintendent of State Police: and
- 2) to change the effective date from the six month following enactment to seven months following enactment.
