The Senate Environment Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 2450 with committee amendments.

Current law sets the basic daily catch and possession limit for striped bass at two fish, as follows: one fish at least 24 inches but less than 28 inches in length and another fish at least 34 inches in length. This bill would change that limit to provide instead that both fish must be at least 28 inches in length.

As amended by the committee, the bill would retain the provision in that law that authorizes the Commissioner of Environmental Protection to establish a "bonus fish" program consistant with the Striped Bass Management Plan of the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission. An approved bonus fish program could allow for the taking of striped bass in addition to the two 28-inch or larger fish allowed under the law as amended by this bill.

The committee amendments also would delete language in the law which established a presumption of violation when a person was found to possess any striped bass or parts of a striped bass from which the head or tail has been removed other than immediately prior to preparation or being served as food, which is less than the minimum size limits prescribed by law. Instead, the committee amendments prohibit the filleting, or the removal of the head or tail, or parts thereof, of any striped bass at sea.

As amended, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 4472.
