1 AN ACT concerning certain payments and amending R.S.27:7-34.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. R.S. 27:7-34 is amended to read as follows:

7 27:7-34. Contracts shall provide for partial payments at least once 8 each month or from time to time as the work progresses on work of construction or maintenance. [Five] Two per centum of the amount 9 10 due on partial payments [on the first 50%] of the total contract price shall be withheld from the contractor pending completion of the 11 12 contract[. Thereafter, on the remaining 50% of the total contract price, no per centum of the partial payments shall be withheld from the 13 14 contractor pending such completion], but upon substantial completion 15 of the contract, as defined by rules or regulations of the department 16 [2%] 1% shall be withheld. At any time during the performance of 17 the work, if work is not progressing, as defined by the "New Jersey 18 Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Road and 19 Bridge Construction," the commissioner may at the commissioner's 20 discretion, ¹[after consultation with the director of construction] services,]¹ increase the withholding to 4% of the payment due. The Senate State Government Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate, No. 2864.

This bill changes the amounts that may be withheld from payments to contractors by the Department of Transportation (DOT) for highway work. Currently, five percent of the amount due on the first 50 percent of the total contract price is to be withheld, but nothing is to be withheld on the remainder, except that upon substantial completion of the work two percent would be withheld. The bill lowers the five percent to two percent but it is to apply to payments of the total contract price, except that upon substantial completion of the work one percent would be withheld.

At any time during the performance of the work, if work is not progressing, as defined by DOT's "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction," the Commissioner of Transportation may, at the commissioner's discretion, increase the withholding to four percent of the payment due.

The committee amended the bill to remove a proposed requirement that the Commissioner of Transportation consult with the director of construction services before increasing the withholding.

This bill is identical to Assembly, No. 4517 of 2005.

Currently, five percent of the amount due on the first 50 percent of the total contract price is to be withheld, but nothing is to be withheld on the remainder, except that upon substantial completion of the work two percent would be withheld. The bill lowers the five percent to two percent but applies it to payments of the total contract price, except that upon substantial completion of the work one percent would be withheld.

At any time during the performance of the work, if work is not progressing, as defined by DOT's "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction," the Commissioner of Transportation may, at the commissioner's discretion, increase the withholding to four percent of the payment due.
