The bill also requires the State Treasurer, in consultation with the Commissioner of Environmental Protection, to establish any procedures or conduct any review necessary to determine that wood or paper products are derived from sustainably managed forests or procurement systems. Finally, the bill authorizes, but does not require, the State Treasurer, in consultation with the Commissioner of Environmental Protection, to adopt any other rules and regulations necessary for the implementation of the act.

The committee amendments remove the language which references contracts for the construction, improvement, or maintenance of any public work to maintain the procurement process used by the Department of Transportation.

As amended, Senate Bill No. 1860 is identical to Assembly Bill No. 1860 (2R).
