The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 4164.

Assembly Bill No. 4164 concerns New Jersey police officers and firefighters subject to mandatory retirement at the age of 65 under the Police and Fireman's Retirement System (PFRS). For a brief period in the 1980's, however, federal law prohibited states from imposing a maximum age at time of appointment (age 35 years) or mandatory retirement requirements based on age. Once federal law was amended in 1986 to permit such requirements, New Jersey's mandatory police officer and firefighter appointment and retirement ages were reinstated.

Unfortunately, one consequence of the reinstatement of the mandatory retirement age is that police officers and firefighters hired when the maximum appointment age was suspended are today are being forced to retire due to age without the ability to achieve certain retirement benefits. In some cases, PFRS members are being forced to retire just weeks before becoming eligible for certain PFRS retirement benefits. This bill provides a limited window of opportunity to PFRS members to remain in employment for a reasonable period in order to gain certain benefits upon retirement.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Division of Pensions and Benefits estimates a minimal fiscal impact to the State and local government funds, due to limited number of individuals eligible.

However, the division notes, this bill would undermine rationale requiring age limitations and subsequently increase State and local employer costs in the future.

BILL DESCRIPTION

Assembly Bill No. 4164 of 2005 provides a limited window of opportunity to PFRS members to remain in employment for a reasonable period in order to gain certain benefits upon retirement.

New Jersey law subjects police officers and firefighters to mandatory retirement at the age of 65 under the PFRS.



FISCAL ANALYSIS

EXECUTIVE BRANCH

The Division of Pensions and Benefits in the Department of the Treasury estimates that this bill would have a minimal fiscal impact on State and local government funds, due to the limited number of individuals who would be eligible for this benefits.

The division notes that if this bill is enacted, it will undermine the rationale for requiring age limitations for public safety officers and there would be an increase in State and local employer benefit costs.
