The Assembly Health and Human Services Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 1932.

As amended by the committee, this bill amends N.J.S.A.10:5-29.5 to prohibit an individual from intentionally interfering with the rights of a person with a disability, who is accompanied by a service or guide dog, or the function or ability to function of a guide or service dog. A person who violates these prohibitions would be subject to a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$500.

The bill takes effect on the 60th day after enactment.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amendments to the bill provide as follows:

- C The penalty is for a violation that is not otherwise prohibited by the "Law Against Discrimination" (which would be subject to a much larger penalty than is provided in the section amended by the bill), and applies to intentional interference with the rights of a person with a disability, who is accompanied by a guide or service dog, or the function or ability to function of a guide or service dog.
- C The term "handicapped, blind or deaf person" is revised to "person with a disability" to be consistent with the other sections of N.J.S.A.10:5-29 et seq.
- C The bill takes effect on the 60th day after enactment, rather than immediately.

The Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1932 (1R).

This bill amends N.J.S.A.10:5-29.5 to prohibit an individual from intentionally interfering with the rights of a person with a disability, who is accompanied by a service or guide dog, or the function or ability to function of a guide or service dog. A person who violates these prohibitions would be subject to a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$500.

This bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 2868 (Karcher), which the committee also reported favorably on this date.
