The Senate Education Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2391with committee amendments.

As amended, this bill provides that a pupil who is disabled and who is placed by his parents or guardians at their own expense in a nonpublic school for treatment of the disability will be eligible to participate in the interscholastic athletic program of the student's resident school district, provided the student otherwise meets the eligibility requirements of the program and the student's participation has the written approval of the board of education of the school district where the program is located.

Under the current rules of the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association, a pupil must be enrolled in a member school district in order to participate in the interscholastic athletic program of the district. A disabled pupil who is placed by a member school district in a school outside the district is, however, also eligible to participate in that member school district's interscholastic athletic program.

The committee amended the bill to clarify that the parents or the guardians of the pupil who is disabled must have placed the pupil in a nonpublic school at their own expense. An additional amendment was included to require the written approval of the board of education of the school district where the program is located rather than the principal of the school.

As reported, Assembly Bill No. 2391 is identical to Senate Bill No. 1215 with Senate committee amendments.

The committee amended the bill to clarify that the parents or the guardians of the pupil who is disabled must have placed the pupil in a nonpublic school at their own expense. An additional amendment was included to require the written approval of the board of education of the school district where the program is located rather than the principal of the school.

As reported, Senate Bill No. 1215 is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2391 with Senate committee amendments.
