1 **AN ACT** concerning the credits of students completing courses in
2 county juvenile detention centers and supplementing chapter 7C of
3 Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

5 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*

8 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, in the
9 case of a student enrolled in an educational program in a county
10 juvenile detention center that meets the standards for a thorough and
11 efficient education developed by the Office of Education in the
12 Juvenile Justice Commission, in consultation with the Commissioner
13 of Education, pursuant to section 9 of P.L. 1979, c.207 (C.18A:7B-5),
14 who subsequently enrolls in a public school district, the district shall
15 accept all days of attendance and courses studied by the student at the
16 county juvenile detention center and apply them toward district
17 requirements for elementary, middle, or high school graduation.

19 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2004-2005 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.
