

The Senate State Government Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate No. 2830.

This bill provides that the title of a person who serves as Acting Governor for a continuous period of at least 180 days will thereafter be, for official and historical purposes, "Governor of the State of New Jersey." It also provides that a temporary discontinuance of service as Acting Governor, due to travel outside of the State or illness, will not render a period of service noncontinuous. The bill will take effect immediately upon enactment and will be retroactive to January 1, 2001.

The committee amended the bill to make clear that the title of a person who serves as Acting Governor for a continuous period of at least 180 days will thereafter be, for official and historical purposes, "Governor of the State of New Jersey"; and that a temporary discontinuance of service as Acting Governor, due to travel outside of the State or illness, will not render a period of service noncontinuous.

This bill is identical to Assembly, No. 4565 of 2005.
