The Assembly Housing and Local Government Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1351 with committee amendments.

This bill, as amended, requires that a final invoice regarding a consumer contract for construction or reconstruction at a residential premises must contain a disclosure by the contractor of the cost of construction permits required to complete the construction or reconstruction of the residential premises, and the amount of any administrative or processing fees that the contractor will charge to obtain the required permits, which is limited to the cost to the contractor to obtain the permit and to record any necessary documents. "Construction or reconstruction" is defined under the bill to mean any work on a residence which will require a permit to be obtained under the "State Uniform Construction Code Act," P.L.1975, c.217 (C.52:27D-119 et seq.), or regulations promulgated thereto, but excludes work on any new home subject to the "New Home Warranty and Builders' Registration Act," P.L.1977, c.467 (C.46:3B-1 et seq.) and for which a certificate of occupancy has been issued. Upon a written complaint filed by a consumer with the Division of Consumer Affairs in the Department of Law and Public Safety, a contractor found to be in violation of this provision shall be subject to a \$500 penalty for each separate violation.

Committee amendments

The committee amended the bill to clarify that the disclosure of the costs of the permits need not be supplied with the initial contract to the consumer, in order to allow time for the contractor to determine those costs. In addition, the amendments clarify that the requirement to disclose permit costs does not apply to newly-constructed homes for which a certificate of occupancy has been issued and which are subject to the "New Home Warranty and Builders' Registration Act," P.L.1977, c.467 (C.46:3B-1 et seq.).

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2004-2005 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

The Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1351 (1R).

This bill would limit the amount that a contractor may charge a consumer for obtaining construction permits for residential premises to the contractor's actual cost to obtain the permits and record necessary documents. The bill would require final invoices for consumer contracts for construction or reconstruction of residential premises to disclose the contractor's cost of obtaining construction permits and the amount of any administrative or processing fees. The bill applies to construction code permits but excludes work on new homes subject to the "New Home Warranty and Builders' Registration Act," P.L.1977, c.467 (C.46:3B-1 et seq.) and for which a certificate of occupancy has been issued. A contractor found to be in violation of this provision would be subject to a \$500 penalty for each separate violation.
