8 39:3-20. For the purpose of this section, gross weight means the 9 weight of the vehicle or combination of vehicles, including load or 10 contents.

11 a. The [director] chief administrator is authorized to issue 12 registrations for commercial motor vehicles other than omnibuses or motor-drawn vehicles upon application therefor and payment of a fee 13 14 based on the gross weight of the vehicle, including the gross weight of 15 all vehicles in any combination of vehicles of which the commercial 16 motor vehicle is the drawing vehicle. The gross weight of a disabled 17 commercial vehicle or combination of disabled commercial vehicles 18 being removed from a highway shall not be included in the calculation 19 of the registration fee for the drawing vehicle.

(1) In the case of vehicles other than trucks transporting 41 ready-mixed concrete, asphalt, stone, sand, gravel, clay and cleanfill: 42 For vehicles not in excess of 5,000 pounds, \$53.50.

For vehicles in excess of 50,000 pounds, \$53.50 plus \$15.50 for 10 11 each 1,000 pounds or portion thereof in excess of 5,000 pounds; and 12 (2) In the case of trucks transporting ready-mixed concrete, asphalt, 13 stone, sand, gravel, clay and cleanfill: 14 For vehicles not in excess of 5,000 pounds, \$53.50. 15 For vehicles in excess of 5,000 pounds and not in excess of 18,000 pounds, \$53.50 plus \$11.50 for each 1,000 pounds or portion thereof 16 17 in excess of 5,000 pounds. 18 For vehicles in excess of 18,000 pounds and not in excess of 50,000 19 pounds, \$53.50 plus \$12.50 for each 1,000 pounds or portion thereof 20 in excess of 5,000 pounds. 21 For vehicles in excess of 50,000 pounds, \$53.50 plus \$13.50 for 22 each 1,000 pounds or portion thereof in excess of 5,000 pounds. 23 b. The [director] chief administrator is also authorized to issue 24 registrations for commercial motor vehicles having three or more axles 25 and a gross weight over 40,000 pounds but not exceeding 70,000 pounds, upon application therefor and proof to the satisfaction of the 26 27 [director] chief administrator that the applicant is actually engaged in construction work or in the business of supplying material, 28 29 transporting material, or using such registered vehicle for construction 30 work. 31 Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, every registration 32 for these commercial motor vehicles shall expire and the certificate thereof shall become void on the last day of the [eleventh] twelfth 33 calendar month following the month in which the certificate was 34 35 issued; provided, however, that the [director] chief administrator may 36 require registrations which shall expire, and issue certificates thereof 37 which shall become void on a date fixed by the [director] chief administrator, which shall not be sooner than three months or later 38 than 26 months after the date of issuance of such certificates, and the 39 fees for such registrations or registration applications, including any 40 41 other fees or charges collected in connection with the registration fee, 42 shall be fixed by the [director] chief administrator in amounts 43 proportionately less or greater than the fees established by law. 5 The registration fee shall be \$22.50 for each 1,000 pounds or 6 portion thereof.

For purposes of calculating this fee, weight means the gross weight,
including the gross weight of all vehicles in any combination of which
such commercial motor vehicle is the drawing vehicle.

Such commercial motor vehicle shall be operated in compliance with the speed limitations of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes and shall not be operated at a speed greater than 45 miles per hour when one or more of its axles has a load which exceeds the limitations prescribed in R.S.39:3-84.

15 c. The [director] chief administrator is also authorized to issue registrations for each of the following solid waste vehicles: two-axle 16 17 vehicles having a gross weight not exceeding 42,000 pounds; tandem 18 three-axle and four-axle vehicles having a gross weight not exceeding 19 60,000 pounds; four-axle tractor-trailer combination vehicles having 20 a gross weight not exceeding 60,000 pounds. Registration is based 21 upon application to the [director] chief administrator and proof to his 22 satisfaction that the applicant is actually engaged in the performance of solid waste disposal or collection functions and holds a certificate 23 24 of convenience and necessity therefor issued by the Department of 25 **Environmental Protection.**

Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, every registration for a solid waste vehicle shall expire and the certificate thereof shall become void on the last day of the [eleventh] <u>twelfth</u> calendar month following the month in which the certificate was issued.

The registration fee shall be \$50 plus \$11.50 for each 1,000 pounds
or portion thereof in excess of 5,000 pounds.

d. The [director] <u>chief administrator</u> is also authorized to issue registrations for commercial motor-drawn vehicles upon application therefor. The registration year for commercial motor-drawn vehicles shall be April 1 to the following March 31 and the fee therefor shall be \$18 for each such vehicle.

At the discretion of the [director] <u>chief administrator</u>, an applicant for registration for a commercial motor-drawn vehicle may be provided the option of registering such vehicle for a period of four years. In the event that the applicant for registration exercises the four-year option, a fee of \$64 for each such vehicle shall be paid to the [director] <u>chief administrator</u> in advance.

If any commercial motor-drawn vehicle registered for a four-year
period is sold or withdrawn from use on the highways, the [director]
<u>chief administrator</u> may, upon surrender of the vehicle registration and
plate, refund \$16 for each full year of unused prepaid registration.

1 e. It shall be unlawful for any vehicle or combination of vehicles 2 registered under this act, having a gross weight, including load or 3 contents, in excess of the gross weight provided on the registration 4 certificate to be operated on the highways of this State.

21 This section shall not be construed to supersede or repeal the 22 provisions of section 39:3-84, 39:4-75, or 39:4-76 of this Title.

23 Of the registration fees collected by the [director] chief f. 24 administrator pursuant to this section for vehicles with gross vehicle 25 weights in excess of 5,000 pounds, an amount equal to \$3 per 1,000 pounds or portion thereof in excess of 5,000 pounds for each 26 27 registration shall be forwarded to the State Treasurer for deposit in the Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Fund established pursuant to section 28 29 17 of P.L.1995, c.157 (C.39:8-75). Moneys in the fund shall be used 30 by the Department of Law and Public Safety and the Department of 31 Transportation for enforcement of laws and regulations governing 32 commercial motor vehicles.

The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2534.

This bill extends the validity of commercial motor vehicle registrations from 11 to 12 months. Pursuant to R.S.39:1-1, the term "commercial motor vehicle" includes every type of motor-driven vehicle used for commercial purposes on the highways, excepting such vehicles as are run only upon rails or tracks and vehicles of the passenger type used for touring purposes or the carrying of farm products and milk. The bill does not change the registration period for omnibuses and motor-drawn vehicles.

The bill also updates references to the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission.
