- C The New Jersey Council on Physical Fitness and Sports established pursuant to N.J.S.A.26:1A-37.6 is authorized to provide grants to assist low-income families in purchasing the protective eyewear. The bill defines "low-income family" to mean a family which qualifies for low-income housing under standards promulgated by the Council on Affordable Housing pursuant to the "Fair Housing Act" (N.J.S.A.52:27D-301 et seq.).
- C No school, community or government agency engaged in organizing, teaching, refereeing or coaching a sports activity as described in the bill is to be liable in a civil action for failure to administer or enforce the provisions of the bill.

The bill takes effect six months after the date of enactment.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2038 (3R) of 2002 (Friscia/Previte), which this committee reported during the 210th Legislature. That bill passed the Assembly 50-17-8 on October 17, 2002 and was pending in the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee at the conclusion of the 2002-2003 session.
