resource for businesses to obtain information and assistance concerning State energy costs ¹[and], potential benefits resulting from switching to or utilizing third-party energy suppliers, State ¹ energy programs, subsidies and grants to reduce ¹energy costs ¹and to promote energy efficiencies ¹.

e. The appointment of a ¹[State] <u>BPU</u>¹ Business Ombudsman to oversee and coordinate the dissemination of energy information needed by businesses is intended to ¹[provide an incentive to]¹ encourage businesses to remain and expand in this State, to attract businesses from other states to relocate to this State and to stimulate business investment.

As amended, this bill establishes the BPU Business Ombudsman (the "ombudsman") in the Board of Public Utilities (the "board") and provides for the President of the board to appoint the ombudsman from within or from outside the board to direct the work of the ombudsman office. The purpose of the ombudsman shall be to act as a centralized information resource for businesses seeking help with increasingly complex matters concerning energy costs and energy programs, subsidies or grants to reduce their energy costs.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee adopted amendments to establish a BPU Business Ombudsman in place of a State Business Ombudsman and to provide for the President of the board to appoint the ombudsman who shall serve at the pleasure of the President.

The amendments further provide for the ombudsman, under the supervision of the board, to direct the work of the office subject to any rules and regulations adopted by the board concerning the general duties and conduct of the ombudsman's office.

The amendments also provide for the funding of the ombudsman office to come from a portion of the monies received by the board under the board's continuing regulation of Basic Generation Service pursuant to section 9 of P.L.1999, c.23 (C.48:3-57) and allows for the board to assess the continuing need for the ombudsman and to consider alternative funding options.

The amendments direct the ombudsman to report annually to the board on the operations of the ombudsman office and to provide other reports to the board as required.

The amendments also make a number of technical changes in the bill to clarify the role of the ombudsman's office.

Assembly Bill No. 3471 (1R), as amended by the committee, establishes the BPU Business Ombudsman (the "ombudsman") in the Board of Public Utilities (the "board") and provides for the President of the Board to appoint the ombudsman from within or from outside the board to direct the work of the ombudsman office. The purpose of the ombudsman shall be to act as a centralized information resource for businesses seeking help with increasingly complex matters concerning energy costs and energy programs, subsidies or grants to reduce their energy costs.

The bill further provides for the ombudsman, under the supervision of the board, to direct the work of the office subject to any rules and regulations adopted by the board concerning the general duties and conduct of the ombudsman office.

The bill also provides for the funding of the ombudsman office to come from a portion of the monies received by the board under the board's continuing regulation of Basic Generation Service pursuant to section 9 of P.L.1999, c.23 (C.48:3-57) and allows for the board to assess the continuing need for the ombudsman and to consider alternative funding options.

The bill directs the ombudsman to report annually to the board on the operations of the ombudsman office and to provide other reports to the board as required.

As referred to the committee, the bill provided for the funding of the ombudsman using a portion of the monies received by the board as a result of the board's inclusion of a retail margin on *all* non-residential customers. In fact, through the issuance of board orders, the BPU establishes a kilowat hour threshold each year beyond which certain larger commerial and industrial customers are assessed a retail margin.

By dropping the reference to *all* non-residential customers, the committee amendment is meant to clarify that the ombudsman position is to be funded using monies received by the board through the assessment of the retail margin and defers to the board's discretion under existing law to establish the annual threshold which determines who is subject to that assessment.

BILL DESCRIPTION

The cost of staffing the Business Ombudsman office will be determined by the BPU. Data is not available to estimate the costs of the proposal at this time. As noted above, the BPU assesses a fee on certain non-residential customers, and revenue from this fee is to provide for the funding of the ombudsman's office from the board's continuing regulation of Basic Generation Service pursuant to sections 3 and 9 of P.L.1999, c.23 (C.48:3-51 and 48:3-57). The bill allows for the board to assess the continuing need for the ombudsman and to consider alternative funding options of the ombudsman as may be necessary. Thus, after appointment of the Ombudsman, the BPU retains the authority to abolish the position.

- a. The attraction and retention of new and existing businesses is vital to the continued economic development of the State.
 - b. The increasing complexity of energy issues and the creation of a competitive energy marketplace, has resulted in obstacles to the attraction and retention of new and existing businesses in this State, especially since other states have developed marketing and promotional materials and programs designed to offer businesses the means to quickly determine energy savings from relocating to another area of the country.
 - c. An effective strategy to counter such efforts, attract new businesses and retain existing businesses in this State, is to provide for the appointment of a BPU Business Ombudsman within the Board of Public Utilities who shall be responsible for providing information to businesses concerning energy costs in the State and to assist businesses with the application for and processing of State energy programs, subsidies and grants to reduce their energy costs.
 - d. It is in the public interest to remain competitive with other states by authorizing the President of the Board of Public Utilities to appoint a BPU Business Ombudsman to act as a centralized resource for businesses to obtain information and assistance concerning State energy costs, potential benefits resulting from switching to or utilizing third-party energy suppliers, State energy programs, subsidies and grants to reduce energy costs and to promote energy efficiencies.
 - e. The appointment of a BPU Business Ombudsman to oversee and coordinate the dissemination of energy information needed by businesses is intended to encourage businesses to remain and expand in this State, to attract businesses from other states to relocate to this State and to stimulate business investment.

- 3. As used in this act:
- "Act" means the "BPU Business Ombudsman Act."
- "Board" means the Board of Public Utilities.
- "Business project or activity" means a new commercial or industrial
 business or enterprise or the expansion or improvement of an existing
 commercial or industrial business or enterprise in this State.

"BPU Business Ombudsman" means the person appointed by the
 President of the Board pursuant to section 4 of this act.

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- 4. a. There is hereby created a BPU Business Ombudsman in the board to provide information and assistance to any business, located in this State or seeking to relocate in this State, with regard to energy costs, potential benefits from switching to or utilizing third-party energy suppliers, State energy programs, subsidies or grants available to businesses to reduce their energy costs and promotion of energy efficiencies.
- 11 b. The ombudsman office shall be headed by a BPU Business Ombudsman who shall be appointed by the President of the Board and 12 13 shall serve at the pleasure of the President of the Board. The BPU Business Ombudsman shall be a person qualified by training, 14 15 experience, or both, to direct the work of the office. In appointing an Ombudsman, the President of the Board may select from, but shall not 16 be restricted to, candidates from within the board as presently 17 18 constructed.
- 19 c. The Ombudsman, under the supervision of the board, shall 20 organize the work of that office and employ such professional, 21 technical, research and clerical staff as may be necessary, proper and 22 expedient to carry out the purposes of P.L. , c. (C.) (now before 23 the Legislature as this bill). The board, in consultation with the Ombudsman, may formulate and adopt rules and regulations and 24 25 prescribe duties for the efficient conduct of the business, work and 26 general administration in connection with P.L., c. The Ombudsman may delegate to subordinate employees such of the Ombudsman's powers as the 28 29 Ombudsman may deem desirable, to be exercised under the 30 Ombudsman's supervision and direction.
- 31 The BPU Business Ombudsman and staff shall be funded 32 through use of a portion of the monies received by the board as a 33 result of the board's inclusion of a retail margin on all non-residential 34 customers pursuant to the board's continuing regulation of Basic Generation Service pursuant to sections 3 and 9 of P.L.1999, c.23 35 36 (C.48:3-51 and 48:3-57). Nothing in P.L., c. (C.) (now before 37 the Legislature as this bill) should be interpreted to restrict the board's 38 discretion to set the level of the retail margin. Should the board 39 determine to reduce or eliminate the retail margin or take any action 40 that might implicate the funding of the activities or position, or both, 41 of the BPU Business Ombudsman, the board shall assess the 42 continuing need for the Ombudsman and upon a determination that the 43 position remains necessary and useful shall consider alternative funding 44 options.

The bill directs the ombudsman to report annually to the board on the operations of the ombudsman and to provide other reports to the board as required.

The committee amended the bill to clarify that the ombudsman position is to be funded using monies received by the board through the assessment of the retail margin on certain hourly-priced and larger non-residential customers pursuant to the board's continuing regulation of basic generation service pursuant to sections 3 and 9 of P.L.1999, c.23 (C.48:3-51 and 48:3-57).

As amended by the committee, Senate Bill, No. 2247 is identical to Assembly Bill, No. 3471 (2R).

As reported, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill, No. 3471 (2R).
