The committee amendments give the Commissioner of Community

Affairs a consultive role in developing plans and regulations to implement the provisions of the bill. The bill also directs counselors and other staff to provide appropriate referrals to individuals who appear to be victims of domestic violence, as well as known victims.

As reported, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 2160 (1R), as also reported by the committee.

#### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:**

The committee amendments clarify that an individual who provides job training counseling pursuant to the bill, shall not provide domestic violence counseling or be regarded as a Certified Domestic Violence Specialist.
