The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 4584, with committee amendments.

Assembly Bill No. 4584, as amended, increases the fees that are added to each motor vehicle registration to pay the operational and maintenance costs of the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program and to fund State Police trooper classes.

The bill increases the current \$1 additional registration fee for the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program Fund from \$1 to \$3 per registration, and establishes an additional registration fee of \$1 dedicated to funding new State Police trooper classes.

The bill also updates references to the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program was established in 1992 and it was then expected that the \$1 fee would cover not only the operational costs of the program, but also generate a surplus that could be utilized for helicopter replacement and maintenance. The current \$1 fee, however, is insufficient to cover the actual operational costs of the program. As a result, supplemental appropriations from the General Fund have been required in recent years to maintain the program and there have been no moneys to either replace or retrofit the State's four medevac helicopters that are, on average, 15 years old.

Each additional dollar of fee generates between \$6 and \$7 million annually. Budgeted State Fiscal Year 2005 costs for the helicopter fleet were approximately \$7.6 million. The increase in fee would provide additional funds of between \$12 million and \$14 million annually. This increased funding is expected to provide sufficient funding to fully cover the program's operational costs and capital needs.

The \$1 fee dedicated to new State Police trooper classes would provide between \$6 million and \$7 million annually. This would be expected to be sufficient to fund four 50-trooper classes annually, based on training costs of approximately \$31,000 per graduating recruit.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The amendments replace a provision that would have increased the fee for the Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program from \$1 to \$4 with provisions that increase the helicopter fee from \$1 to \$3 and establish the \$1 fee for funding new State Police trooper classes.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 4584 (1R), with committee amendments.

This bill increases the fees that are added to each motor vehicle registration to pay the operational and maintenance costs of the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program and to fund State Police trooper classes.

The bill increases the current \$1 additional registration fee for the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program Fund from \$1 to \$3 per registration, and establishes an additional registration fee of \$1 dedicated to funding new State Police trooper classes.

The bill also updates references to the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission.

As amended and reported, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 2934, as also amended and reported by the committee.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee amended the bill to change the effective date from the first day of the third month after enactment to July 1, 2006.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program was established in 1992 and it was then expected that the \$1 fee would cover not only the operational costs of the program, but also generate a surplus that could be utilized for helicopter replacement and maintenance. The current \$1 fee, however, is insufficient to cover the actual operational costs of the program. As a result, supplemental appropriations from the General Fund have been required in recent years to maintain the program and there have been no moneys to either replace or retrofit the State's four medevac helicopters that are, on average, 15 years old.

Each dollar added to the registration fee is expected to generate between \$6 and \$7 million annually. Budgeted State Fiscal Year 2005

costs for the helicopter fleet were approximately \$7.6 million. The \$2 increase in the fee will provide additional funds of between \$12 million and \$14 million annually. This increased funding is expected to provide sufficient funding to fully cover the program's annual, estimated operational costs and capital needs.

The \$1 fee dedicated to new State Police trooper classes is estimated to provide between \$6 million and \$7 million annually. This is expected to be sufficient to fund four 50-trooper classes annually, based on training costs of approximately \$31,000 per graduating recruit.

According to a spokesman with the Office of the Attorney General, the budgeted Fiscal Year 2005 costs for the helicopter fleet are \$7,574,034.48. The total expenses for Fiscal Year 2004, Fiscal Year 2003 and Fiscal Year 2002 were \$7,845,866, \$6,082,277 and \$5,870,427 respectively.

OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The Office of Legislative Services estimates that the MVC will annually collect between \$24,000,000 and \$28,000,000 in fees from a \$4 surcharge, an increase of \$18,000,000 to \$21,000,000 above current collections.

The MVC has been collecting a \$1 surcharge on motor vehicle registrations since 1999 to fund the operations of the State Police helicopter fleet. This surcharge generates between \$6 million and \$7 million annually. An estimated \$1.8 million is transferred to the Department of Health for services of medical personnel. The remaining funding amount, which is allocated to the Department of Law and Public Safety, does not fully cover the expenses associated with the operation and maintenance of the helicopter fleet.

The current fleet is comprised of four Medevac helicopters which are on average, 15 years old. The revenue currently raised does not provide sufficient moneys to cover the costs of new helicopters. A new twin engine Sikorsky, for example is estimated to cost \$12.5 million, depending on the amount and type of equipment added. The additional \$3 increase on motor vehicle registrations will provide the funding necessary to purchase new helicopters within one to two years after the bill's implementation.

The Office of Legislative Services notes that while the \$3 surcharge increase will provide the additional revenue needed to purchase replacement helicopters quickly, in future years it will generate more revenue than is needed to annually fund the operational and maintenance costs of the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program.

BILL DESCRIPTION

Assembly Bill No. 4584 (2R) of 2005 increases the fee which is added to each motor vehicle registration to cover the operational, maintenance and capital costs associated with the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program and to provide funding for State Trooper classes.

The New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program was established



in 1992 and it was expected that the \$1 surcharge fee incorporated in the enabling legislation would cover not only the operational costs of the program, but also generate a surplus that could be utilized for helicopter replacement and maintenance.

The current \$1 fee, however, is insufficient to cover the actual operational costs of the program. As a result, supplemental appropriations from the General Fund have been required in recent years to maintain the program and there have been no moneys to either replace or retrofit the State's four Medevac helicopters that are, on average, 15 years old.

The total \$3 surcharge proposed in the bill would generate between \$18,000,000 and \$21,000,000 annually, providing sufficient funding to fully cover the program's operational costs and capital needs.

The additional \$1 surcharge fee proposed under the bill is to fund State Police trooper classes. This surcharge would generate between \$6,000,000 and \$7,000,000 annually, which is to be deposited in a separate dedicated account. Under the bill, the Legislature is to annually appropriate the balance in this fund to the Department of Law and Public Safety for the funding of new State Police trooper classes.

This bill increases the fees that are added to each motor vehicle registration to pay the operational and maintenance costs of the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program and to fund State Police trooper classes.

The bill increases the current \$1 additional registration fee for the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program Fund from \$1 to \$3 per registration, and establishes an additional registration fee of \$1 dedicated to funding new State Police trooper classes.

The bill also updates references to the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission.

As amended and reported, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 4584 (1R), as also amended and reported by the committee.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee amended the bill to change the effective date from the first day of the third month after enactment to July 1, 2006.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program was established in 1992 and it was then expected that the \$1 fee would cover not only the operational costs of the program, but also generate a surplus that could be utilized for helicopter replacement and maintenance. This fee generates between \$6 to \$7 million annually. An estimated \$1.8 million of that amount is transferred each year to the Department of Health and Senior Services of medical personnel services. Budgeted State Fiscal Year 2005 costs for the helicopter fleet were approximately \$7.6 million. The current \$1 fee is insufficient to cover the actual operational costs of the program. As a result, supplemental appropriations from the General Fund have been required in recent years to maintain the program and there have been no moneys to either replace or retrofit the State's four Medevac helicopters that are, on average, 15 years old.

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) notes that the \$2 increase in the fee will provide additional funds of between \$12 million and \$14 million annually. An annual total yield from the aggregate \$3 fee for the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program will generate between \$18,000,000 and \$21,000,000 annually, which will provide the funding necessary to purchase new helicopters within one to two years after the bill's implementation. The OLS notes that additional \$2 fee in future years will generate more revenue than is needed to cover the annual operational and maintenance costs of the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program.

The additional \$1 fee dedicated to new State Police trooper classes is estimated to provide between \$6 million and \$7 million annually. This is expected to be sufficient to fund four 50-trooper classes annually, based on training costs of approximately \$31,000 per graduating recruit.

The New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program was established in 1992 and it was expected that the \$1 surcharge fee incorporated in the enabling legislation would cover not only the operational costs of the program, but also generate a surplus that could be utilized for helicopter replacement and maintenance.

The current \$1 fee, however, is insufficient to cover the actual operational costs of the program. As a result, supplemental appropriations from the General Fund have been required in recent years to maintain the program and there have been no moneys to either replace or retrofit the State's four Medevac helicopters that are, on average, 15 years old.

The total \$3 surcharge proposed in the bill would generate between \$18,000,000 and \$21,000,000 annually, providing sufficient funding to fully cover the program's operational costs and capital needs.

The additional \$1 surcharge fee proposed under the bill is to fund State Police trooper classes. This surcharge would generate between \$6,000,000 and \$7,000,000 annually, which is to be deposited in a separate dedicated account. Under the bill, the Legislature is to annually appropriate the balance in this fund to the Department of Law and Public Safety for the funding of new State Police trooper classes.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

EXECUTIVE BRANCH

According to a spokesperson with the Office of the Attorney General, the budgeted FY05 costs for the helicopter fleet are \$7,574,034.48. The total expenses for FY04, FY03 and FY02 were \$7,845,866; \$6,082,277 and \$5,870,427 respectively.

OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The Office of Legislative Services estimates that the Motor Vehicle Commission will annually collect between \$24,000,000 and \$28,000,000 in fees from a \$4 surcharge, an increase of \$18,000,000 to \$21,000,000 above current collections.

The MVC has been collecting a \$1 surcharge on motor vehicle registrations since 1999 to fund the operations of the State Police helicopter fleet. This surcharge generates between \$6,000,000 and \$7,000,000 annually. An estimated \$1.8 million of that amount is transferred each year to the Department of Health and Senior Services for medical personnel services. The remaining amount, which is allocated to the Department of Law and Public Safety, does not fully cover the expenses associated with the operation and maintenance of the helicopter fleet.

The current fleet is comprised of four Medevac helicopters which are, on average, 15 years old. The revenue currently raised does not provide sufficient moneys to cover the costs of new helicopters. A new twin engine Sikorsky, for example, is estimated to cost \$12,500,000, depending on the amount and type of equipment added. The additional \$2 surcharge on motor vehicle registrations, which will generate between \$12,000,000 and \$14,000,000 annually, will provide the funding necessary to purchase new helicopters within one to two years after the bill's implementation.

The OLS notes that while the new \$2 surcharge will provide the additional revenue needed to purchase replacement helicopters quickly, in future years it will generate more revenue than is needed to cover the annual operational and maintenance costs of the New Jersey Emergency

Medical Service Helicopter Response Program.

The \$1 surcharge to fund State Police trooper classes will generate between \$6,000,000 and \$7,000,000 annually. Since it costs approximately \$31,000 to train a State Police trooper, this surcharge will generate sufficient revenues to fund four 50 member trooper classes each year.
