Although current law is clear that it is the intent of the Legislature that National Guard members and surviving children and spouses are to be admitted with no payment of tuition, at least one county college has chosen to demand out-of-county tuition of a Guard member, masking it as a "differential fee." This bill specifically prohibits that practice.

Current law at section 21 of P.L.1999, c.46 (C.18A:62-24) grants any Guard member up to 15 tuition-free credit hours at any public institution of higher education in this State, if (a) the member has completed his or her Initial Active Duty Training and is an active member in good standing, (b) the member has been accepted to and is enrolled in good standing at the institution, and (c) the member has applied for all available State and federal student grants and scholarships for which he or she is eligible.
