The Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1071.

As amended by the committee, this bill would allow local government treasurers, tax collectors, municipal court judges, and municipal court administrators to be covered by a blanket bond policy obtained by the local government unit or through a joint insurance fund of which the local government unit is a member. Under current law, these employees must be covered under individual bonds.

The committee amended the bill in order to clarify that the bill applies to municipal court administrators rather than to municipal court clerks.

As amended, this bill allows local government treasurers, tax collectors, and municipal court judges and administrators to be covered by a blanket bond policy or joint insurance fund obtained by the local government unit, instead of requiring that these employees obtain individual bond coverage.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amended the bill to change a reference from municipal court "clerks" to municipal court "administrators," to achieve consistency with other current statutory provisions. The bill, as amended, is identical to its Senate counterpart, Senate Bill No. 1071(1R).
