6 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
7 *of New Jersey:*

9 1. a. The Commissioner of the Department of Personnel shall  
10 provide, by regulation, for intergovernmental transfers by law  
11 enforcement officers, including county sheriff and corrections  
12 officers, as part of the department's intergovernmental transfer  
13 program. These law enforcement officers, county sheriff and  
14 corrections officers shall be granted all privileges under the  
15 intergovernmental transfer program, including the option to waive  
16 all accumulated sick leave and seniority rights.

17 b. The waiver of accumulated sick leave and seniority rights  
18 shall require the consent in writing of the receiving jurisdiction, the  
19 affected employee, and the Department of Personnel.

20 c. The sending jurisdiction shall not pay supplemental  
21 compensation for accumulated sick leave to any law enforcement  
22 officer, county sheriff or corrections officer, approved for an  
23 intergovernmental transfer and shall certify, to the receiving  
24 jurisdiction and the Department of Personnel, that no supplemental  
25 compensation was paid.

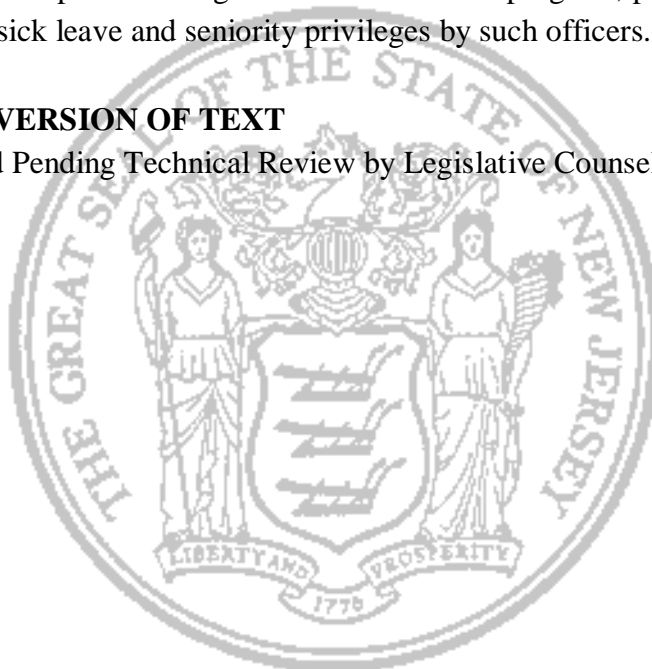

Assembly Bill No. 1551 is identical to Senate Bill No. 269 of 2006.

The Senate Law and Public Safety and Veterans' Affairs Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 269.

This bill directs the Commissioner of the Department of Personnel to provide by regulation that law enforcement officers, including county sheriff and corrections officers, may opt to participate in the intergovernmental transfer program.

The bill requires that the regulations grant officers who have applied for an intergovernmental transfer the option to waive their accumulated sick leave and seniority rights. The receiving jurisdiction, affected employee and the Department of Personnel would consent to this waiver in writing.

The sending jurisdiction would be prohibited from paying supplemental compensation to the affected employee for any accumulated sick leave.

It is the committee's understanding that corrections officers would be able to transfer only to another corrections officer position under the provisions of this bill.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2006 legislative session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.
