The Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1217.

This bill amends N.J.S.A.9:6-8.75 to expand the responsibilities of the "New Jersey Task Force on Child Abuse and Neglect" to include:

--educating the public about the problems of, and coordinating activities relating to, child abuse and neglect;

--developing a Statewide plan to prevent child abuse and neglect and mechanisms to facilitate child abuse and neglect prevention strategies in coordination with the Division of Prevention and Community Partnerships, which was established in 2004 as part of the Child Welfare Reform Plan;

--mobilizing citizens and community agencies in a proactive effort to prevent and treat child abuse and neglect; and

--fostering cooperative working relationships between State and local agencies responsible for providing services to victims of child abuse and neglect and their families.

N.J.S.A.9:6-8.75 currently states that the purpose of the 25member task force is to study and develop recommendations regarding the most effective means of improving the quality and scope of child protective services provided or supported by State government, including a review of the practices and policies utilized by the Division of Youth and Family Services in order to optimize coordination of child abuse-related services and investigations, promote the safety of children at risk of abuse or neglect, and ensure a timely determination with regard to reports of alleged child abuse.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 1526 (Oliver), which was reported favorably by the Assembly Human Services Committee on this date.
