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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 1 of P.L.1991, c.452 (C.27:5F-36) is amended to read as follows:

The Assembly Transportation and Public Works Committee reports favorably with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 3385.

As reported, this amended bill permits a firm engaged in the retail sale of new motorcycles to offer the motorcycle safety education course administered by the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission. As in the case of public and private educational institutions under current law, a retail dealer wishing to offer the course would have to be approved to do so by the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission.

The bill prohibits the dealer from restricting enrollment in the course, or setting the fee for such enrollment, based on whether a person purchased a motorcycle or other motor vehicle from the dealer.

The bill also provides that the chief administrator may impose upon an entity seeking approval to provide the motorcycle safety education course, a course certification fee for each location at which the entity intends to offer motorcycle range instruction. The chief administrator is to collect from each entity approved to provide the motorcycle safety education course a road test waiver fee for each student who has successfully completed the course and has qualified for a waiver of the road test portion of the examination required to obtain a motorcycle license. The monies collected from the imposition of these fees are to be deposited in the Motorcycle Safety Education Fund and are to be used to help defray the costs associated with the program.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amendments clarify which entities are eligible to provide the motorcycle safety education course, permit the chief administrator to impose course certification fees, provide that the chief administrator is to collect road test waiver fees from those students qualified for a waiver of the road test portion of the examination to obtain a motorcycle license, provide for the dispositions of monies collected from the fees imposed, and change the effective date of the bill to allow the commission time to enact pertinent regulations.
