The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2792 with committee amendments.

This amended bill would authorize the governing body of a county of the first class, by resolution, to grant tenure in office to a county road supervisor who holds a valid public works manager certificate and has previously acquired tenure as a municipal superintendent of public works under the provisions of section 2 of P.L.1981, c.383 (C.40A:9-154.6).

R.S.40A:6-1 defines a county of the first class as one having a population in excess of 550,000 and a population density greater than 3,000 persons per square mile, according to the most recent federal decennial census. There are three counties in the State that met these criteria after the 2000 federal decennial census: Bergen (population 884,118), Essex (population 792,305) and Hudson (population 608,975) counties.

The committee amended the bill by deleting the requirement that the person qualifying for tenure has served as a county road supervisor for a period of 10 years and replacing it with the requirement that the person has previously acquired tenure as a municipal superintendent of public works.
