#### P.L. 2007, CHAPTER 299, approved January 13, 2008 Senate, No. 2934 (First Reprint)

AN ACT concerning the loss or theft of a firearm and supplementing 1 2 chapter 58 of Title 2C of the New Jersey Statutes. 3 4 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 The legal owner of a firearm, '[immediately]' upon 7 1. discovering that the firearm is lost or stolen, shall report the loss or 8 9 theft <sup>1</sup>within 36 hours<sup>1</sup> to the chief law enforcement officer of the municipality in which the loss or theft occurred or, if the 10 11 municipality does not have a local police force,  $\frac{1}{10^{1}}$  the 12 Superintendent of State Police. <sup>1</sup>[If the lost or stolen firearm is used in the commission of a 13 crime, the legal owner of the lost or stolen firearm shall not be 14 civilly liable for any damages resulting from that crime if the legal 15 16 owner complied with the reporting requirements of this section]. 17 A person who violates the provisions of this section shall be liable to a civil penalty of not less than \$500 for a first offense, and not 18 19 less than \$1,000 for any second or subsequent offense. The civil 20 penalty shall be collected pursuant to the "Penalty Enforcement Law of 1999," P.L.1999, c.274 (C.2A:58-10 et seq.)<sup>1</sup> 21 22 23 2. The Senate Law and Public Safety and Veterans' Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 2934.

As amended and reported by committee, this bill requires the legal owner of a firearm, upon discovering that the firearm is lost or stolen, to report the loss or theft of that firearm within 36 hours to the chief law enforcement officer of the municipality in which the theft occurred or, if the municipality does not have a local police force, the Superintendent of State Police. Under the amended bill, a legal owner of a firearm who fails to report the loss or theft of the firearm within the 36-hour period is subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$500 for a first offense, and not less than \$1,000 for any second or subsequent offense.

The committee amended the bill to require the legal owner of a firearm to report the loss or theft of that firearm with 36 hours after discovery of the loss or theft rather than immediately upon discovery. The committee also added a provision that an owner who fails to report the loss or theft is subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$500 for a first offense, and not less than \$1000 for any second or subsequent offense. The amendments also remove language specifying that the legal owner of a lost or stolen firearm who complied with the reporting requirements would not be civilly liable for any damages resulting from a crime.

The Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 4620.

Assembly Bill No. 4620 requires the legal owner of a firearm to report the loss or theft of that firearm to the chief law enforcement officer of the municipality in which the theft occurred or, if the municipality does not have a local police force, the Superintendent of State Police. The report must be made immediately upon discovering that loss or theft.

The bill specifies that the legal owner of a lost or stolen firearm will not be civilly liable for any damages resulting from a crime in which the lost or stolen firearm was used if the legal owner complied with the bill's reporting requirement.

## **STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

#### DATED: JANUARY 3, 2008

The Assembly Judiciary Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 4620.

As amended, the bill requires the legal owner of a firearm, upon discovering that the firearm is lost or stolen, to report the loss or theft of that firearm within 36 hours to the chief law enforcement officer of the municipality in which the theft occurred or, if the municipality does not have a local police force, to the Superintendent of State Police. Under the amended bill, a legal owner of a firearm who fails to report the loss or theft of the firearm within the 36-hour period is subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$500 for a first offense, and not less than \$1,000 for any second or subsequent offense.

The committee amended the bill to require the legal owner of a firearm to report the loss or theft of that firearm with 36 hours after discovery of the loss or theft rather than immediately upon discovery. The committee also added a provision that an owner who fails to report the loss or theft is subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$500 for a first offense, and not less than \$1000 for any second or subsequent offense. The amendments also remove language specifying that the legal owner of a lost or stolen firearm who complied with the reporting requirements would not be civilly liable for any damages resulting from a crime.

These amendments make this bill identical to S2934(1R).

#### COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

1. Amends section 1 of the bill to require the legal owner of a firearm to report the loss or theft of that firearm within 36 hours after discovery of the loss or theft rather than immediately upon discovery.

2. Provides that an owner who fails to report the loss or theft is subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$500 for a first offense, and not less than \$1,000 for any second or subsequent.

3. Removes language specifying that the legal owner of a lost or stolen firearm who complied with the reporting requirements would not be civilly liable for any damages resulting from a crime.
