

The Assembly Military and Veterans' Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly, No. 4253.

Under current law, in order to qualify for tuition-free enrollment at a public institution of higher education, a member of the New Jersey National Guard must apply for all available State student grants and scholarships and all available federal student grants and scholarships for which the member is eligible. This bill requires the member to also apply for all tuition benefits available through the United States Department of Veterans Affairs for which the member is eligible. The bill imposes a similar requirement on the child or surviving spouse of a member of the New Jersey National Guard who is eligible under current law for a tuition waiver at a public institution if available space permits and tuition-paying students constitute the minimum number required for the course. - The Office of Legislative Services estimates that the bill's provisions will reduce State costs by an indeterminate amount.
- Current law directs the State to reimburse public institutions of higher education for members of the New Jersey National Guard who enroll in the institution on a tuition-free basis. The law also provides a tuition waiver to the child or surviving spouse of a Guard member who was killed in the performance of his duties if the child or spouse is enrolled in a public institution, available classroom space permits, and tuition-paying students constitute the minimum number required to finance the course. The law does not require any State reimbursement for a child or surviving spouse enrolled under the program.
- Under current law, a member of the New Jersey National Guard is required to apply for all
 available State student grants and scholarships and all available federal student grants and
 scholarships as a condition of eligibility for the tuition-free enrollment. The State is
 responsible for the costs of tuition remaining after the application of these State and federal
 student scholarships and grants.



- The bill provides that in addition to applying for all available State and federal student grants and scholarships, a New Jersey National Guard member is also required to apply for all tuition benefits available through the United States Department of Veterans Affairs in order to qualify for the tuition-free enrollment.
- For the 2009-2010 academic year, under the Post 9/11 GI Bill, eligible New Jersey National Guard members are entitled to up to \$450.67 per academic credit to finance undergraduate tuition at a New Jersey public institution of higher education. This benefit provided to New Jersey National Guard members eligible for full education benefits under the Post 9/11 GI Bill would completely offset the undergraduate tuition charges at a New Jersey public institution of higher education.

BILL DESCRIPTION

Assembly Bill No. 4253 (1R) of 2009, requires members of the New Jersey National Guard and the child or surviving spouse of a guard member killed in the performance of his duties to apply for all tuition benefits available through the United States Department of Veterans Affairs in order to qualify for tuition-free enrollment at a public institution of higher education.

Under current law, in order to qualify for tuition-free enrollment at a public institution of higher education, a member of the New Jersey National Guard, must apply for all available State student grants and scholarships and all available federal student grants and scholarships for which the person is eligible. This bill requires the member to also apply for all tuition benefits available through the United States Department of Veterans Affairs for which the member is eligible. The bill imposes a similar requirement on the child or surviving spouse of a member of the New Jersey National Guard who is eligible under current law for a tuition waiver at a public institution if available space permits and tuition-paying students constitute the minimum number required to finance the course. The bill's provisions would first apply to the 2010-2011 academic year.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

EXECUTIVE BRANCH

OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The Office of Legislative Services estimates that the bill's provisions will decrease State expenditures by an indeterminate amount.

Under current law the State is required to reimburse public institutions of higher education for the tuition costs of National Guard members who enroll in the institution on a tuition-free basis. The law also provides a tuition waiver to the child or surviving spouse of a Guard member who was killed in the performance of his duties if the child or spouse is enrolled in a public institution, if available classroom space permits and tuition-paying students constitute the

minimum number required to finance the course. The law does not require State reimbursement for a child or surviving spouse enrolled under the program.

While Guard members are required under current law to apply for all State and federal student aid for which they may be eligible as a condition of tuition-free enrollment, they are not currently required to apply for veteran education benefits available through the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. This bill would impose that requirement.

Information available on the United States Department of Veterans Affairs' website indicates that for the 2009-2010 academic year eligible New Jersey Guard members are entitled to up to \$450.67 per academic credit under the Post 9/11 GI Bill to finance undergraduate tuition at a New Jersey public institution of higher education. The benefit provided to New Jersey National Guard members eligible for full education benefits under the Post 9/11 GI Bill would completely offset the undergraduate tuition charges at a New Jersey public institution of higher education. Consequently, State reimbursement will not be required for certain New Jersey National Guard members and there will be a reduction in the State expenditure required to support the program.

- 2) provide for a similar limit in the case of a child or surviving spouse of a National Guard member who is eligible under current law for a tuition waiver at a public institution of higher education if available classroom space permits and tuition paying students constitute the minimum number required for the course; and
- 3) provide that an application by a National Guard member for tuition benefits under the "Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2008" will not be required if the member has elected a tuition benefit transfer as authorized under federal law.
