The Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2449 (1R).

As part of Governor Whitman's Reorganization Plan No. 004-1998, which became effective on May 29, 1998, the Division of Elections, together with all of its functions, powers, and duties, was transferred from the Department of State to the Department of Law and Public Safety.

Senate Bill No. 2449 (1R) reverses that transfer. Specifically, the bill provides that the Secretary of State will replace the Attorney General as the chief election official in this State and the Division of Elections, together with all of its functions, powers, and duties, is transferred from the Department of Law and Public Safety to the Department of State.

The bill provides that all responsibility for the budget, fiscal, and personnel matters of the Division of Elections is at the same time transferred to the Department of State, and that whenever in any rule, regulation, order, contract, document, judicial or administrative proceeding or otherwise, reference is made to the Division of Elections in the Department of Law and Public Safety, the same will mean the Division of Elections in the Department of State.

Finally, for the purpose of the "National Voter Registration Act," and the "Help America Vote Act of 2002", the designation of the State's chief election official is changed in the bill from the Attorney General to the Secretary of State.

As reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2929, as amended and reported by the committee on this same date.

The Senate State Government Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate, No. 2449.

This bill reverses the transfer. 

The Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 2929.

As part of Governor Whitman's Reorganization Plan No. 004-1998, which became effective on May 29, 1998, the Division of Elections, together with all of its functions, powers, and duties, was transferred from the Department of State to the Department of Law and Public Safety.

As amended and reported by the committee, Assembly Bill No. 2929 reverses that transfer. Specifically, the amended bill provides that the Secretary of State will replace the Attorney General as the chief election official in this State and the Division of Elections, together with all of its functions, powers, and duties, is transferred from the Department of Law and Public Safety to the Department of State.

The amended bill provides that all responsibility for the budget, fiscal, and personnel matters of the Division of Elections is at the same time transferred to the Department of State, and that whenever in any rule, regulation, order, contract, document, judicial or administrative proceeding or otherwise, reference is made to the Division of Elections in the Department of Law and Public Safety, the same will mean the Division of Elections in the Department of State.

Finally, for the purpose of the "National Voter Registration Act," and the "Help America Vote Act of 2002", the designation of the State's chief election official is changed in the amended bill from the Attorney General to the Secretary of State.

As amended and reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 2449(1R), also reported by the committee on this same date.
