As used in the substitute, a "period of religious observance" means any day or portion thereof on which a religious observance imposes a substantial burden on an individual's ability to vote. The substitute also authorizes the Secretary of State to change the date provided by current law for a nonpartisan municipal election if that date coincides with a period of religious observance.

This substitute is identical to Assembly, No. 3186 (ACS) of 2008.
