1 **AN ACT** concerning overseas absentee ballots and amending various parts of the statutory law.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 1 of P.L.1976, c.23 (C.19:59-1) is amended to read as follows:
- 9 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Overseas 10 Residents [Federal Election] Absentee Voting Law."
- 11 (cf: P.L.1976, c. 23, s.1)

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- 2. Section 2 of P.L.1976, c.23 (C.19:59-2) is amended to read as follows:
 - 2. As used in this act:
 - a. "United States" means each of the several states, the District of Columbia, Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa and the Virgin Islands; the term does not mean or include the Canal Zone or any other territory or possession of the United States.
 - b. "Residing abroad" means residing outside the United States.
 - c. "Federal election" means any general, special or primary held for the purpose of nominating or electing any candidate for the office of President or Vice President of the United States, Presidential elector, United States Senator or member of the United States House of Representatives.
 - d. "Overseas [federal election] voter" means any person in military service who, by reason of active duty or service, is absent on the date of an election from the place of residence in New Jersey where the person is or would be qualified to vote, and any citizen of the United States residing abroad who (1) immediately prior to his departure from the United States was domiciled in New Jersey and (a) was registered to vote, or had all the qualifications to register and vote, in New Jersey; or (b) had all the qualifications to register and vote in New Jersey other than having attained 18 years of age but has since attained that age; or (c) would, but for residence, have the qualifications to register and vote in New Jersey; (2) does not maintain a residence in the United States and is not registered or qualified to vote elsewhere in the United States; and (3) holds a

valid passport or card of identity and registration issued under authority of the Secretary of State of the United States.

e. ["Fax"] <u>"Electronic means"</u> means any transmission made by an electronic telefacsimile machine or <u>a similar</u> device or by any other form of electronic transmission [device which] <u>including</u>, <u>but</u> not exclusive to electronic mail, that transports an authentic copy of a document from one user [of the device] to another.

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- 3. Section 3 of P.L.1976, c.23 (C.19:59-3) is amended to read as follows:
- 3. Upon compliance with the provisions of this act <u>P.L.1976</u>, c.23 (C.19:59-1 et seq.), any person meeting the qualifications of an "Overseas [federal election] voter" may register to vote and may apply for and vote by absentee ballot in any [federal] election held in the election district of this State in which [he] the voter was formerly domiciled.

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- 4. Section 4 of P.L.1976, c.23 (C.19:59-4) is amended to read as follows:
- 22 4. a. Requests for an application to vote in [a federal] an election as an overseas [federal election] voter may be made by or 23 on behalf of an applicant to the county clerk of the county in which 24 25 the applicant was formerly domiciled or to the Secretary of State of 26 New Jersey if the applicant does not know the county of [his] the 27 applicant's former domicile. All such applications shall be 28 forwarded to such voters by air mail or [by fax] electronic means, 29 if so requested by the voter. Any overseas [Federal election] voter 30 requesting that an application for a ballot be sent to that voter by 31 [fax] <u>electronic means</u> shall supply to the Secretary of State or the 32 county clerk, as [is] appropriate, the telephone number and location 33 to which the application is to be sent or the electronic address of the voter, as may be appropriate. To qualify an applicant to be sent a 34 35 ballot by air mail in order to vote in an election, the applicant's 36 completed application shall be received by the appropriate county 37 clerk on or before the thirtieth day preceding the election. To 38 qualify an applicant to be sent a ballot by [fax] electronic means in 39 order to vote in an election, the applicant's completed application 40 shall be received by the appropriate county clerk on or before the 41 fourth day preceding the election. 42
 - b. An overseas [federal election] voter may use [a] the federal postcard application form to register to vote or to apply for an overseas [federal election voter] ballot for a federal election. The voter may send the form by air mail or [by fax] electronic means to either the appropriate county clerk or the Secretary of State and, in

- b. There shall also be sent to the applicant by air mail or [by fax] electronic means such instructions and portions of the law or regulations as the Secretary of State shall direct.
 - c. Any overseas [federal election] voter requesting that a ballot be sent to that voter by [fax] electronic means shall indicate on the application for the ballot the telephone number and location to which the ballot is to be sent or the electronic address of the voter, as may be appropriate.

[As to] For each voter whose 20 application is approved , the county clerk shall deliver to the county 21 board of elections the completed application form for retention by 22 the board for signature comparison with that on the certificate on 23 the inner envelope containing the ballot upon its receipt.

Each county clerk shall send by air mail, with each overseas [federal election voter] ballot transmitted by such means, appropriate printed instructions for its completion and return, together with an inner and outer envelope similar to that required as to civilian absentee ballots with a legend on the inner envelope stating "Overseas [Federal Election Voter] Ballot."
- b. Each county clerk shall send to each overseas [federal election] voter requesting that an overseas [federal election voter]

- ballot be sent to that voter by [fax] electronic means all appropriate printed instructions for its completion and return. The printed instructions sent to each such voter shall include a certificate substantially the same as provided for in section 9 of P.L.1976, c.23 (C.19:59-9).
 - c. The printed instructions sent with each overseas [federal election voter] ballot, including instructions sent by electronic means, shall include a copy of the following notice:

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PENALTY FOR FRAUDULENT VOTING

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Any person who knowingly violates any of the provisions of the Overseas Residents [Federal Election] Absentee Voting Law, or who, not being entitled to vote thereunder, fraudulently votes or attempts to vote thereunder or enables or attempts to enable another person, not entitled to vote thereunder, to vote fraudulently thereunder or who prevents or attempts to prevent by fraud the voting of any person legally entitled to vote under this act, shall be guilty of an indictable offense, and upon conviction thereof shall be subject, in addition to such other penalties as are authorized by law, to disenfranchisement unless and until pardoned or restored by law to the right of suffrage.

If the overseas [federal] voter is 32 33 eligible to vote therein, the county clerk shall send the ballot to the 34 voter as soon as practicable by [fax] electronic means using the 35 telephone number or electronic address supplied by the voter for that purpose. If the overseas [federal election] voter is not eligible 36 to vote in the State or the county desired, notice of noneligibility 37 shall be provided to the voter by [fax] electronic means as soon as 38 39 practicable after the receipt of the request.

- 10. a. For overseas [federal election voter] ballots other than such ballots sent to the voter by [fax] electronic means, the procedure for completing the ballot shall be as follows:

Upon completion of the ballot by indicating [his] the voter's choice of candidates for the offices named, the ballot shall be placed in the inner envelope and sealed. Upon completion and signing in [his] the voter's handwriting the certificate attached to the inner envelope, the inner envelope shall be placed in the outer envelope, which when sealed shall be mailed postage prepaid to the county board of elections whose address is printed thereon.

b. For overseas [federal election voter] ballots sent to the voter by [fax] electronic means, the procedure for completing the ballot shall be as follows:

After the ballot is received and completed by the voter by indicating that person's choice of candidates for the offices named, the ballot shall be placed in a secure envelope. Upon completion and signing in the voter's handwriting of the certificate sent to the voter pursuant to section 8 of P.L.1976, c.23 (C.19:59-8), it shall be placed in the same envelope as the voted ballot. The envelope shall then be sealed securely and sent immediately by air mail to the appropriate county board of elections in this State.

c. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections a. and b. of this section, a copy of a voted overseas [federal election voter] ballot may be transmitted by [fax] electronic means to the appropriate county board of elections in this State. Such a ballot shall be subject to the provisions of sections 3 and 4 of P.L.1995, c.195 (C.19:59-14 and C.19:59-15).

The county board of elections shall take all necessary precautions to preserve the security of the ballot materials and specifically shall ensure that the vote cast by a voter using a [faxed] ballot transmitted by electronic means is not revealed, except to the extent necessary by law or judicial determination. Upon the completion of all inspections of a [faxed] ballot transmitted by electronic means required by law, the board or any employee thereof acting under its direction shall promptly separate the waiver certification from the [faxed] ballot transmitted by electronic means. Any person handling such a [faxed] ballot shall not identify the votes cast by any voter, except upon judicial determination.
 - d. Prior to certification of the results of the election, the county board shall:
 - (1) compare the information on the [faxed] copy transmitted by electronic means of each voted ballot with the same on the original voted ballot sent by air mail by the voter who [faxed] transmitted to the county board a copy of the voted ballot by electronic means, and the signature on the statement received by [fax] electronic means with the signature on the certificate received by air mail; and
 - (2) ascertain whether an original voted ballot has been received for each **[**faxed**]** copy of a voted ballot received <u>by electronic means</u> and counted.
- Whenever the particulars of the [faxed] copy of a voted ballot

 [of a voter] transmitted by electronic means do not conform exactly
 with the particulars of the original voted ballot sent by air mail to

the county board afterwards by that voter and whenever an original 1 2 voted ballot has not been received which corresponds to a [faxed] 3 copy of a voted ballot transmitted by electronic means which has 4 been received and counted by the county board, those ballots and all 5 other pertinent documents and information relative to those ballots 6 shall be turned over to the superintendent of elections in counties

having a superintendent and the prosecutor in all other counties for

8 further investigation and action.

e. Within 30 days after the election, the county board shall gather and keep together the [faxed] copy of the voted ballot transmitted by electronic means, the certified statement and the original voted ballot sent by air mail of each voter who transmitted a copy of a voted ballot by [fax] electronic means. Those ballots needed for an investigation conducted by the superintendent of elections or the county prosecutor, as the case may be, or by any other law enforcement official shall be returned to the county board as soon as practicable after the conclusion of the investigation. All ballots and documents relative to a [faxed] copy of a voted ballot transmitted by electronic means and received by the county board shall be retained by it for a period of one year following the day of the election. The superintendent of elections in counties having a superintendent and the prosecutor in all other counties shall have the authority to impound all such documents whenever [he] the superintendent or prosecutor shall deem such action necessary.

Military service voters may also apply for a military service ballot by sending a federal postcard application form to the undersigned.

On the application for a military service ballot, military service voters may request that a military service ballot be sent for all subsequent elections through and including the next two regularly scheduled general elections for federal office which take place after the request is made.

(NOTE: **MILITARY** SERVICE VOTER **CLAIMING** MILITARY STATION AS HOME ADDRESS FOR VOTING PURPOSES MAY NOT USE MILITARY ABSENTEE BALLOT UNLESS REGISTERED TO VOTE IN THE MUNICIPALITY WHERE SUCH STATION IS LOCATED.)

(date of election) kindly complete the application form below and send to the undersigned, or write or apply in person to the undersigned at once requesting that a civilian absentee ballot be forwarded to you. Such request must state your home address, and the address to which said ballot should be sent, and must be dated and signed with your signature. If any person has assisted you to complete the absentee ballot application, the name, address and signature of the assistor must be provided on the application. Also, you must sign and date the application for it to be valid and processed. No person who is a candidate in the election for which the voter requests an absentee ballot may provide any assistance in the completion of the ballot or may serve as an authorized No civilian absentee ballot will be furnished or forwarded to any applicant unless request therefor is received not less than seven days prior to the election, and contains the foregoing information.

Voters who are permanently and totally disabled, and any other voters who wish to vote only by absentee ballot in a general election, and who state that on their request shall, after their initial request and without further action on their part, be forwarded an absentee ballot application by the county clerk for future elections in which they are eligible to vote and until the voter requests that he or she no longer be sent an application. Permanently and totally disabled voters also have the option of indicating on their absentee ballot applications that they would prefer to receive absentee ballots for each election that takes place during the remainder of this calendar year. Permanently and totally disabled voters who exercise this option will be furnished with absentee ballots for each election that takes place during the remainder of this calendar year, without further action on their part.

"Overseas federal election voter" means any person in military service who, by reason of active duty or service, is absent on the date of an election from the place of residence in New Jersey where the person is or would be qualified to vote, and any citizen of the United States residing abroad who (1) immediately prior to his departure from the United States was domiciled in New Jersey and (a) was registered to vote, or had all the qualifications to register and vote, in New Jersey; or (b) had all the qualifications to register and vote in New Jersey other than having attained 18 years of age but has since attained that age; or (c) would, but for residence, have the qualifications to register and vote in New Jersey; (2) does not maintain a residence in the United States and is not registered or qualified to vote elsewhere in the United States; and (3) holds a valid passport or card of identity and registration issued under authority of the Secretary of State of the United States.
 - e. ["Fax"] <u>"Electronic means"</u> means any transmission made by an electronic telefacsimile machine or <u>a similar</u> device, or by any other form of electronic transmission [device which] <u>including</u>, but not exclusive to electronic mail, that transports an authentic copy of a document from one user [of the device] to another.

Upon the completion of all inspections of a [faxed] ballot transmitted by electronic means required by law, the board or any employee thereof acting under its direction shall promptly separate the waiver certification from the [faxed] ballot transmitted by electronic means. Any person handling such a [faxed] ballot shall not identify the votes cast by any voter, except upon judicial determination.
 - d. Prior to certification of the results of the election, the county board shall:
 - (1) compare the information on the [faxed] copy <u>transmitted by electronic means</u> of each voted ballot with the same on the original voted ballot sent by air mail by the voter who [faxed] <u>transmitted</u> to the county board a copy of the voted ballot <u>by electronic means</u>, and the signature on the statement received by [fax] <u>electronic means</u> with the signature on the certificate received by air mail; and

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(2) ascertain whether an original voted ballot has been received for each [faxed] copy of a voted ballot received by electronic means and counted.

Whenever the particulars of the [faxed] copy of a voted ballot [of a voter] transmitted by electronic means do not conform exactly with the particulars of the original voted ballot sent by air mail to the county board afterwards by that voter and whenever an original voted ballot has not been received which corresponds to a [faxed] copy of a voted ballot transmitted by electronic means which has been received and counted by the county board, those ballots and all other pertinent documents and information relative to those ballots shall be turned over to the superintendent of elections in counties having a superintendent and the prosecutor in all other counties for further investigation and action.

Within 30 days after the election, the county board shall gather and keep together the [faxed] copy of the voted ballot transmitted by electronic means, the certified statement and the original voted ballot sent by air mail of each voter who transmitted a copy of a voted ballot by [fax] electronic means. Those ballots needed for an investigation conducted by the superintendent of elections or the county prosecutor, as the case may be, or by any other law enforcement official shall be returned to the county board as soon as practicable after the conclusion of the investigation. All ballots and documents relative to a [faxed] copy of a voted ballot transmitted by electronic means and received by the county board shall be retained by it for a period of one year following the day of the election. The superintendent of elections in counties having a superintendent and the prosecutor in all other counties shall have the authority to impound all such documents whenever he shall deem such action necessary.

1 STATEMENT

This bill permits overseas voters to vote by overseas absentee ballot in any election held in this State, including State and local elections, thereby allowing overseas voters greater participation in the electoral process. The Senate State Government Committee reports favorably Senate, No. 1460.

This bill permits overseas voters to vote by overseas absentee ballot in any election held in this State, including State and local elections, thereby allowing overseas voters greater participation in the electoral process. Under current law, an overseas voter, including an overseas voter in the military, can only vote by overseas absentee ballot in federal elections.

The bill also expands the methods of transmitting ballots used by overseas voters who wish to vote. The bill removes the term "fax" in those sections of law pertaining to this type of voting and replaces it with the term "electronic means," a term defined to encompass fax machines and any other form of electronic transmission including, but not exclusively, electronic mail.

Under the bill, an overseas voter could request and receive information about voting in any election by electronic mail and also complete and return an electronic ballot that has been received by electronic mail. Governor Corzine Signs Legislation to Expand Voting Rights

Allows Deployed Military Personnel to Vote in State Elections

TRENTON - Governor Jon S. Corzine today signed legislation to expand voting rights for military personnel and New Jersey citizens overseas to include state and local elections. Previously overseas voters, including military personnel, could only vote by overseas absentee ballot in federal elections. This new legislation corrects a fundamental flaw in the law and will now allow for greater participation in the electoral process

"The right to vote is the most fundamental element of any democracy," Governor Jon S. Corzine said. "I could not

be more proud to sign this legislation to ensure that those who have sacrificed so much to protect our rights have the opportunity to participate fully in the electoral process."

In addition to expanding voting rights, the bill also expands the methods of transmitting ballots used by overseas voters who wish to vote. Currently the law only allows for votes to be transmitted by fax, but this legislation will expand the law to include any other form of electronic communication, including e-mail. In order to ensure the integrity of the voting process, a paper copy of the ballot must also be submitted for verification purposes after the transmittal of the electronic ballot.

"In a society powered by technology, it is only logical to make proper use of all the tools at our disposal," said Governor Corzine. "In signing this legislation, we are giving realistic access to our democratic system to the people who have taken on the responsibility of defending it overseas."

The Legislation (A2204/S1460) was sponsored in the Assembly by Assemblypersons Joan M. Quigley, Jack Conners, Vincent Prieto, Gary S. Schaer and Caroline Casagrande and Jay Webber. It was sponsored in the Senate by Nicholas J. Sacco, and John H. Adler.

"The act of voting should not be a daunting or impossible task simply because a person is an ocean away from home," said Assemblywoman Joan M. Quigley (D-Hudson). "It's past time that we streamlined the process to account for the near-global connectivity afforded us by the advent of the Internet and e-mail." "Our election laws must be reflective of the times so that the act of voting, even for someone overseas or at war, is as simple as possible," said Assemblyman Jack Conners (D-Camden), a former Army National Guardsman and Army Reservist.

"For too long, New Jersey's election laws have lagged far behind the state of current technology," said Senator Sacco, D-Hudson and Bergen. "With the prevalence of e-mail and other forms of electronic transmission, State election regulators can easily and cheaply communicate with potential voters, wherever they are in the world. Thanks to this new law, we can increase participation in the democratic process in New Jersey, particularly for those in our military serving overseas." "We must give our brave men and women from New Jersey that are serving in the Armed Forces overseas every opportunity to have a voice in their government," said Senator Adler, D-Cherry Hill. "By making it easier for State residents overseas to vote electronically, we can guarantee that our soldiers who have sacrificed so much for their country aren't forced to sacrifice their right to vote."
