The Assembly Military and Veterans' Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly, No. 789.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2008-2009 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

### COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee amended the bill to include registrations issued under the "New Jersey Controlled Dangerous Substances Act" (C.24:21-1 et seq.). The amendments also specify that any late renewal fees, reinstatement fees and other reinstatement requirements will be waived by the applicable professional or occupational board or the Division of Consumer Affairs upon application by the licensee or registrant within 120 days after he or she returns from active service, and that the licensee or registrant must submit documentation verifying his or her active military service.

These amendments provide that any license issued by a professional or occupational board designated in section 2 of P.L.1978, c.73 (C.45:1-15) and any registration issued under the "New Jersey Controlled Dangerous Substances Act," P.L.1970, c.226 (C.24:21-1 et seq.), will not expire while the licensee or registrant is an active member of the Armed Forces of the United States and will be extended for up to 120 days after the licensee's or registrant's return from active service.
