The Assembly Transportation, Public Works and Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably and with amendments Assembly Bill No. 3930.

As reported, this amended bill would establish the "New Jersey Scenic and Historic Highways Program" to be administered by the Commissioner of Transportation. The purpose of the program is to encourage the State and counties and municipalities throughout the State to preserve the unique and intrinsic qualities of roadways deemed to have scenic and historic value.

The bill allows the Legislature, through the passage of legislation, to designate roadways in this State for inclusion in the program. Once a roadway has been designated for inclusion in the program, the Department of Transportation and all other entities with jurisdiction over the roadway or the surrounding area are encouraged to preserve and promote the scenic, historic, recreational, cultural, or archaeological qualities, or any combination of the foregoing, that served as the basis for the roadway's inclusion in the program.

The department and other public entities with jurisdiction over the roadway, or its surrounding area, are encouraged not to make any physical changes to the roadway, or its surrounding area, that would degrade any of its scenic, historic, recreational, cultural, or archaeological qualities. The preservation and promotion of a roadway which has been designated for inclusion in the program shall include, but not be limited to, the following activities: making safety improvements to the roadway to the extent that such improvements are necessary to accommodate increased traffic and changes in the types of vehicles using the roadway due to its inclusion in the program; constructing rest areas, turnouts, highway shoulder improvements, passing lanes, overlooks, interpretive facilities, and other facilities for use by pedestrians and bicyclists along the roadway; making improvements that will enhance access to recreational areas in the vicinity of the roadway; protecting scenic, historical, natural, archaeological, and cultural resources in areas adjacent to the roadway; and developing and promoting tourist information to the public, including interpretive information about the program and the specific roadways that have been included in the program.

4) "Kinderkamack Road Scenic and Historic Highway," which extends from Hackensack to the New York state line near Montvale in Bergen County;

5) "Franklin Avenue Scenic and Historic Highway," which extends from Oakland to Wyckoff in Bergen County;

6) "Dunkerhook Road Scenic and Historic Highway," which extends from Fair Lawn to Paramus in Bergen County;

7) "Piermont and Rockleigh Roads Scenic and Historic Highway," which consists of Piermont Road, from Tenafly to the New York state line in Bergen County, and Rockleigh Road, from Northvale to the New York state line in Bergen County; and

8) "Grand Avenue Scenic and Historic Highway," which extends from Englewood to Ridgefield in Bergen County.

The bill also permits the Department of Transportation and any other public entity with jurisdiction over a roadway which has been designated for inclusion in the program to erect signs indicating that a roadway has been granted such a designation.

### S3048 TURNER

1 AN ACT establishing the "New Jersey Scenic and Historic 2 Highways Program," and supplementing Title 27 of the Revised 3 Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. The Legislature finds and declares that: 9 Certain portions of the State highway system are notable for a. 10 their scenic, historic, recreational, cultural, and archaeological value 11 and are worthy of official designation as scenic and historic 12 highways to provide special consideration of their unique features and special role in the highway system; 13 14 The public interest would be served by the creation of a b. 15 coordinated scenic and historic highways program to enhance 16 recreation, preserve and protect scenic, historic, recreational, 17 cultural, and archaeological resources, encourage economic development through tourism, and educate the public about the 18 19 history and culture of this State; 20 c. New Jersey lags behind other states around the country in terms of preserving roadways which have scenic, historic, and other 21 22 intrinsic qualities; and 23 d. It is altogether to fitting and proper for the Legislature to 24 establish a "New Jersey Scenic and Historic Highways Program" in 25 the Department of Transportation which will encourage the promotion and preservation of the scenic, historic, recreational, 26 27 cultural, and archaeological qualities of certain roadways, and areas surrounding such roadways, throughout the State. 28 29 30 2. As used in this act: 31 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Transportation. 32 "Department" means the Department of Transportation. "Program" means the New Jersey Scenic and Historic Highways 33 34 Program established by section 3 of P.L. ,c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). 35 "Public entity" means the State, any county, municipality, 36 37 district, public authority, public agency, and any other political 38 subdivision or public body in the State. 39 40 3. There is hereby established a "Scenic and Historic a. Highways Program" to be administered by the commissioner in 41 42 accordance with the provisions of this act. The program is 43 established to encourage the State and counties and municipalities 44 throughout the State to preserve the unique and intrinsic qualities of roadways deemed to have scenic, historic, recreational, cultural, or 45 46 archaeological value.

47 b. Any roadway in this State, including the surrounding area thereof, which has scenic, historic, recreational, cultural, or 48

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archaeological value may be designated through an act of the
 Legislature for inclusion in the program.

3 c. Once a roadway has been designated for inclusion in the 4 program, the department and all other public entities with 5 jurisdiction over the roadway or the surrounding area are 6 encouraged to preserve and promote the scenic, historic, 7 cultural, or archaeological recreational, qualities, or any 8 combination of the foregoing, that served as the basis for the 9 roadway's inclusion in the program. The department and public 10 entities with jurisdiction over a roadway which has been included in 11 the program are encouraged to not make any physical changes to 12 the roadway, or its surrounding area, that would degrade any of its scenic, historic, recreational, cultural, or archaeological qualities. 13 14 The preservation and promotion of a roadway that has been 15 designated for inclusion in the program shall include, but not be 16 limited to, the following activities:

(1) Making safety improvements to the roadway to the extent
that such improvements are necessary to accommodate increased
traffic and changes in the types of vehicles using the roadway due
to its inclusion in the program;

(2) Constructing rest areas, turnouts, highway shoulder
improvements, passing lanes, overlooks, interpretive facilities, and
other facilities for use by pedestrians and bicyclists along the
roadway;

(3) Making improvements that will enhance access torecreations areas in the vicinity of the roadway;

(4) Protecting scenic, historical, recreational, cultural, andarchaeological resources in areas adjacent to the roadway; and

(5) Developing and promoting tourist information to the public,
including interpretive information about the program and the
specific roadways that have been designated for inclusion in the
program.

34 4. The following roadways are designated for inclusion in the35 New Jersey Scenic and Historic Highways Program:

a. "Quaker Road Scenic and Historic Highway," which consists
of the entire length of Quaker Road beginning at the road's
intersection with Province Line Road in the township of Princeton,
county of Mercer, extending in a general northerly direction, and
ending at the intersection of Quaker Road and Lawrenceville Road
in the township of Princeton, county of Mercer;

b. "Closter Dock Road Scenic and Historic Highway," which
consists of the entire length of Closter Dock Road beginning at the
road's intersection with Harrington Avenue in the borough of
Closter, county of Bergen, extending in a general easterly direction,
and ending at the intersection of Closter Dock Road and U.S. Route
9W in the borough of Alpine, county of Bergen;

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1 c. "Huyler's Landing Road Scenic and Historic Highway," 2 which consists of the entire length of Huyler Landing Road 3 beginning at the road's intersection with East Madison Avenue in 4 the borough of Cresskill, county of Bergen, extending in a general 5 easterly direction, and ending at the intersection of Huyler Landing 6 Road and Vaccaro Drive in the borough of Cresskill, county of 7 Bergen;

8 d. "Kinderkamack Scenic and Historic Highway," which 9 consists of the entire length of roadway beginning at the road's 10 intersection with Johnson Avenue in the city of Hackensack, county 11 of Bergen, extending in a general northerly direction and becoming 12 North Kinderkamack Road, continuing in a general northerly 13 direction, and ending at the New York state line in the vicinity of 14 the borough of Montvale, county of Bergen;

e. "Franklin Avenue Scenic and Historic Highway," which consists of the entire length of Franklin Avenue beginning at the road's intersection with Ramapo Valley Road in the borough of Oakland, county of Bergen, extending in a general easterly direction, and ending at the intersection of Franklin Avenue and Van Blarcom Lane in the township of Wyckoff, county of Bergen;

f. "Dunkerhook Road Scenic and Historic Highway," which
consists of the entire length of Dunkerhook Road beginning at the
road's intersection with Saddle River Road in the borough of Fair
Lawn, county of Bergen, extending in a general northeasterly
direction, and ending at the intersection of Dunkerhook Road and
Paramus Road in the borough of Paramus, county of Bergen;

g. "Piermont and Rockleigh Roads Scenic and HistoricHighway," which consists of the following portions of roadway:

(1) The entire length of Piermont Road beginning at the road's
intersection with County Road and East Clinton Avenue in the
borough of Tenafly, county of Bergen, extending in a general
northerly direction, and ending at the New York state line in the
vicinity of the borough of Northvale, county of Bergen, and

(2) The entire length of Rockleigh Road beginning at the road's
intersection with Piermont Road in the borough of Northvale,
county of Bergen, extending in a general northerly direction, and
ending at the New York state line in the vicinity of the borough of
Rockleigh, county of Bergen; and

h. "Grand Avenue Scenic and Historic Highway," which
consists of the entire length of Grand Avenue beginning at the
road's intersection with East Palisade Avenue in the city of
Englewood, Bergen County, extending in a general southerly
direction, and ending at the intersection of Grand Avenue and
Broad Avenue in the borough of Ridgefield, Bergen County.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 3048.

This amended bill would establish the "New Jersey Scenic and Historic Highways Program" to be administered by the Commissioner of Transportation. The purpose of the program is to encourage the State and counties and municipalities throughout the State to preserve the unique and intrinsic qualities of roadways deemed to have scenic and historic value.

The bill allows the Legislature, through the passage of legislation, to designate roadways in this State for inclusion in the program. Once a roadway has been designated for inclusion in the program, the Department of Transportation and all other entities with jurisdiction over the roadway or the surrounding area are encouraged to preserve and promote the scenic, historic, recreational, cultural, or archaeological qualities, or any combination of the foregoing, that served as the basis for the roadway's inclusion in the program.

The department and other public entities with jurisdiction over the roadway, or its surrounding area, are encouraged not to make any physical changes to the roadway, or its surrounding area, that would degrade any of its scenic, historic, recreational, cultural, or archaeological qualities. The preservation and promotion of a roadway which has been designated for inclusion in the program shall include, but not be limited to, the following activities: making safety improvements to the roadway to the extent that such improvements are necessary to accommodate increased traffic and changes in the types of vehicles using the roadway due to its inclusion in the program; constructing rest areas, turnouts, highway shoulder improvements, passing lanes, overlooks, interpretive facilities, and other facilities for use by pedestrians and bicyclists along the roadway; making improvements that will enhance access to recreational areas in the vicinity of the roadway; protecting scenic, historical, natural, archaeological, and cultural resources in areas adjacent to the roadway; and developing and promoting tourist information to the public, including interpretive information about the program and the specific roadways that have been included in the program.

The bill designates the following roadways for inclusion in the New Jersey Scenic and Historic Highways Program:

1) "Quaker Road Scenic and Historic Highway" in Princeton Township in Mercer County;

2) "Closter Dock Road Scenic and Historic Highway," which extends from Closter to Alpine in Bergen County;

3) "Huyler's Landing Road Scenic and Historic Highway" in Cresskill in Bergen County;

4) "Kinderkamack Road Scenic and Historic Highway," which extends from Hackensack to the New York state line near Montvale in Bergen County;

5) "Franklin Avenue Scenic and Historic Highway," which extends from Oakland to Wyckoff in Bergen County;

6) "Dunkerhook Road Scenic and Historic Highway," which extends from Fair Lawn to Paramus in Bergen County;

7) "Piermont and Rockleigh Roads Scenic and Historic Highway," which consists of Piermont Road, from Tenafly to the New York state line in Bergen County, and Rockleigh Road, from Northvale to the New York state line in Bergen County; and

8) "Grand Avenue Scenic and Historic Highway," which extends from Englewood to Ridgefield in Bergen County.

The bill also permits the Department of Transportation and any other public entity with jurisdiction over a roadway which has been designated for inclusion in the program to erect signs indicating that a roadway has been granted such a designation.

The committee amended the bill to correct typographical and editorial errors.

With these amendments, this bill is identical to A-3930(1R).
