INTRODUCED NOVEMBER 15, 1968

AN ACT to amend and supplement "An act concerning crimes and supplementing Title 2A of the New Jersey Statutes," approved July 27, 1967 (P. L. 1967, C. 182).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. Section 1 of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 1. Any person who enters any building, structure or place used
- 4 for any educational purpose with the intent of committing therein
- 5 any indictable offense shall be guilty of a high misdemeanor, pun-
- 6 ishable by imprisonment for not more than 5 years, or a fine of
- 7 not more than \$10,000.00 or both.
- 1 2. Any person, other than a bona fide student therein or parent
- 2 or legal guardian of such student or a teacher, administrator, or
- 3 other school employee while in the performance of his duties, who
- 4 enters any building, structure or place used for any educational
- 5 purpose with the intent of disrupting classes or of otherwise inter-
- 6 fering with the peace and good order of the place shall be guilty
- 7 of a misdemeanor.
- 1 3. Any person who obstructs, interferes with, assaults, or
- 2 threatens bodily harm to any student, teacher, administrator, school
- 3 employee, or parent, or legal guardian, of any student, or any other
- 4 person lawfully seeking to enter a school building or any other
- 5 building, structure or place used for any educational purpose shall
- 6 be guilty of a high misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment for
- 7 not more than 5 years, or a fine or not more than \$10,000.00, or both.
- 1 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
