STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 5, 1968

By Senators HIERING, RINALDI, HAUSER, KNOWLTON and  
KAY

Referred to Committee on Education

AN ACT concerning higher education, providing for the creation,  
award and administration of State tuition aid grants for use by  
qualified students in accredited institutions of collegiate grade,  
and authorizing appropriations therefor.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "New Jersey  
2 Higher Education Tuition Aid Act."

1 2. There are hereby created State tuition aid grants which shall  
2 be maintained by the State, awarded and administered pursuant  
3 to this act, and used by the holders thereof for undergraduate  
4 study in accredited institutions of higher education in New Jersey.

1 3. It shall be the duty of the State Scholarship Commission in  
2 the State Department of Higher Education to administer the pro-  
3 visions of this act.

1 4. State tuition aid grants shall be awarded by the State Schol-  
2 arship Commission to all eligible applicants without any limitation  
3 on the number to be awarded in any year other than the amount  
4 of appropriations available therefor.

1 5. State tuition aid grants shall be awarded without regard to  
2 race, religion, creed, or sex.

1 6. No person shall be awarded a State tuition aid grant unless

2 (a) He has been a resident of New Jersey for a period of not  
2a less than 12 months immediately preceding the date of his appli-  
3 cation for such tuition aid.

4 (b) He has demonstrated financial need for such tuition aid as  
5 determined by paragraph 7b of this act and in accordance with pro-  
7 cedures to be established by the State Scholarship Commission.

7 (c) He has demonstrated high moral character, good citizenship,  
8 and dedication to American ideals.

9 (d) He has applied for State tuition aid and has been deter-  
10 mined to be eligible for such tuition aid.

11 (e) He has complied with all the rules and regulations adopted  
12 pursuant to this act by the State Scholarship Commission for the  
13 award, regulation, and administration of State college tuition aid.

1 7. A college tuition aid grant shall be awarded annually to each  
2 eligible, qualified full-time student enrolled in a curriculum leading  
3 to a degree in an institution of collegiate grade in New Jersey  
4 approved or accredited by the State Board of Higher Education in  
5 accordance with the following:

6 (a) Eligibility. To each full-time resident student registered as  
7 a freshman after September 1, 1968, as a freshman or sophomore  
8 after September 1, 1969, as a freshman, sophomore or junior after  
9 September 1, 1970, and as a freshman, sophomore, junior or senior  
10 student after September 1971, the State shall grant an amount as  
11 provided in paragraph (b) of this section 7. No student shall be  
12 eligible for grants in more than the equivalent of 8 semesters of  
13 undergraduate education. No student shall be eligible for grants  
14 unless he maintains such minimum standards of academic perform-  
15 ance as are required by the institution in which he is enrolled. No  
16 student shall be eligible for a tuition aid grant who is enrolled  
17 in a course of study leading to a degree in theology, divinity or  
18 religious education.

19 In the event a student for any reason ceases to continue to be  
20 enrolled during the course of an academic year, he shall cease to  
21 be eligible for tuition aid.

22 (b) Amount of grant. The amount of tuition aid grant to any  
23 student under this act for any semester shall not exceed the amount  
24 of tuition normally charged a student at the institution of attend-  
25 ance less \$225.00. The maximum tuition aid grant to any one stu-  
26 dent in 1 academic year shall not exceed \$1,000.00.

27 No recipient of a State competitive scholarship shall receive  
28 any tuition aid grant for any academic period for which he has  
29 been awarded a State competitive scholarship.

30 The amount of grant to be paid for each semester or equivalent  
31 shall be based on the figure represented by the effective income of  
32 the eligible student together with the effective income of the parent  
33 or parents providing a majority of the eligible student's support.  
34 "Effective income" of the eligible student and his parents shall  
35 be defined as total income subject to Federal income tax less per-  
36 sonal dependent exemptions and standard or itemized deductions  
37 as eligible under Federal income tax regulations pursuant to the

38 United States Internal Revenue Code as amended with a further  
39 allowance of \$400.00 for each dependent.

40 The following schedule shall be used for determining grants:

41	Effective Income	Amount of Grant Each Semester

43	\$5,001.00 - \$6,000.00 .....	\$400.00
44	\$6,001.00 - \$7,000.00 .....	\$300.00

46	\$8,001.00 - \$9,000.00 .....	\$100.00
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1 8. The State Scholarship Commission may adopt rules and regu-  
2 lations, prescribe and provide appropriate forms for application,  
3 and employ such persons, contract for such services and make such  
4 additional expenditures as may be necessary or appropriate for  
5 effectuating the provisions of this act.

1 9. This act shall not be construed as granting any authority to  
2 control or influence the policies of any educational institution be-  
3 cause it accepts students receiving tuition aid grants, nor to require  
4 any such institution to admit or once admitted to continue in such  
5 institution any tuition aid recipient.

1 10. There is appropriated to the State Department of Higher  
2 Education to be expended by the State Scholarship Commission  
3 for the purposes of this act such sums as shall be included in any  
4 annual or supplemental appropriation act.

1 11. This act shall take effect immediately.
