AN ACT concerning notification of eligibility for the NJ STARS Program and supplementing P.L.2004, c.59 (C.18A:71B-81 et seq.)

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. In September of each school year, ¹the board of education of a school district or the chief school administrator of a nonpublic school shall provide each student in the 9th grade with general information on the New Jersey Student Tuition Assistance Reward Scholarship (NJ STARS) Program created pursuant to P.L.2004, c.59 (C.18A:71B-81 et seq.).
- b. In September of each school year, the board of education of a school district or the chief school administrator of a nonpublic school shall notify each student in the 11th grade who is ranked in the top [30%] 25.0% of the class of his potential to qualify for the [New Jersey Student Tuition Assistance Reward Scholarship (NJ STARS) Program created pursuant to P.L.2004, c.59 (C.18A:71B-81 et seq.)] NJ STARS Program if the student's class rank at the time of high school graduation is within the top [20%] 15.0% of the graduating class.
 - ¹[b. In January of each school year, the board of education of a school district or the chief school administrator of a nonpublic school shall notify each student in the 12th grade who may be eligible for the NJ STARS Program upon high school graduation in accordance with the provisions of P.L.2004, c.59 (C.18A:71B-81 et seq.) of his potential program eligibility

 The notification shall include information about the rigorous course of study required to qualify for the program.
- A student in the 12th grade shall be notified of conditional eligibility for the NJ STARS Program by the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority in accordance with the provisions of section 2 of P.L.2008, c.124 (C.18A:71B-85.1)¹.
- c. The notification ¹by the board of education or chief school administrator ¹ required pursuant to subsections a. and b. of this section shall be communicated via regular or electronic mail or sent home with the student and include a brief description of the NJ STARS Program and the requirements for eligibility for the program.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. In September of each school year, the board of education of a school district or the chief school administrator of a nonpublic school shall notify each student in the 11th grade who is ranked in the top 30% of the class of his potential to qualify for the New Jersey Student Tuition Assistance Reward Scholarship (NJ STARS) Program created pursuant to P.L.2004, c.59 (C.18A:71B-81 et seq.) if the student's class rank at the time of high school graduation is within the top 20% of the graduating class.

STATEMENT

This bill provides that the board of education of a school district or the chief school administrator of a nonpublic school must notify certain students in the 11th and 12th grades that they may be eligible for the New Jersey Student Tuition Assistance Reward Scholarship (NJ STARS) Program upon graduation from high school.

Under the bill, school districts and nonpublic schools must notify, in September, each 11th grade student who ranks in the top 30% of the class that he may qualify for the NJ STARS Program if his class rank upon high school graduation is within the top 20% of the class. This bill also requires school districts and nonpublic schools to notify, in January, each 12th grade student who is expected to be eligible for the NJ STARS Program upon high school graduation of his potential eligibility, as determined by his meeting the eligibility requirements of the NJ STARS Program.

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 601 with committee amendments.

As amended, this bill requires the board of education of a public school or the chief school administrator of a nonpublic school to provide, in September of each school year, general information on the New Jersey Student Tuition Assistance Reward Scholarship (NJ STARS) Program to students enrolled in the 9th grade. The committee amended the bill to:

- 2) provide that notification to students in the 11th grade of the potential to qualify for the NJ STARS Program will be made to students in the top 25.0% of the class rather than the top 30% of the class, and will include information on the need for a student to complete a rigorous course of study in order to qualify for NJ STARS;
- 3) specify that a student in the 12th grade will be notified of conditional eligibility for the NJ STARS Program by the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority in accordance with the provisions of current law; and
- 4) update the academic year to which the bill's provisions are first applicable.

As amended and reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2702 (1R), which also was reported by the committee on this same date.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2008-2009 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.
