31 **SPONSOR'S STATEMENT**

32

33 This bill requires the Office of Emergency Management to have
34 accessible storage sites stocked with the necessary equipment
35 needed in cases of flooding.

36 The Superintendent of the New Jersey State Police is required to
37 establish a list of supplies needed by emergency relief workers in
38 occurrences of flooding. Equipment may consist of heavy duty
39 vehicles equipped to handle flood waters, materials to close of
40 roads where needed and protective gear such as boots and masks for
41 rescue and relief workers safe.

42 The bill requires the Superintendent, along with the
43 Commissioner of Environmental Protection, to designate the flood
44 prone areas and the locations within those areas where these
45 emergency supplies are to be stored.

46 This bill makes these supplies readily available to relief workers
47 in flood prone areas.

The Senate Law and Public Safety and Veterans' Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 451.

As amended, this bill requires the Office of Emergency Management to maintain a regional directory database containing a listing of public and private entities that provide emergency supplies and which identifies emergency supplies and other resources these entities can make available during an emergency.

"Emergency supplies" as defined in the bill means, but is not limited to: equipment such as vehicles, including boats; materials for road closures such as road signs, flares, cones and lights; personal protective gear; emergency food rations; and first aid materials.

The committee amended the bill to require the Office of Emergency Management to maintain a regional directory database. As introduced, the bill required the Superintendent of State Police to direct the Office of Emergency Management to establish a list of supplies needed during periods of flooding and directed the office to provide for the prior placement of emergency supplies in flood prone areas. The committee amendments expand the provisions of the bill to include other types of emergencies.

The committee amendments also give the Office of Emergency Management the discretion to adopt rules and regulations to effectuate the bill's provisions; as introduced, the office was required to adopt rules and regulations.

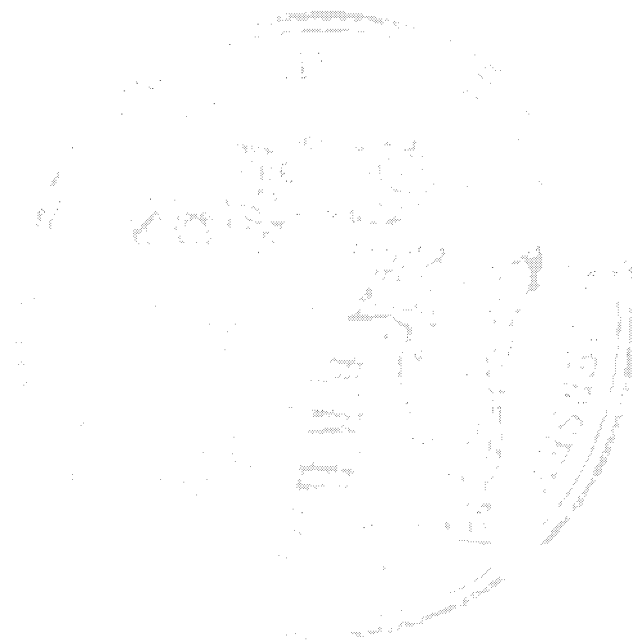
