# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED JANUARY 26, 1970

Referred to Committee on County and Municipal Government

AN ACT to amend "An act concerning the compensation of the mayor and the commissioners in certain cities of the fourth class governed by chapters 70 to 76 of Title 40 ("Commission Form of Government Law") of the Revised Statutes, and supplementing chapter 72 of Title 40 of the Revised Statutes," approved July 7, 1950 (P. L. 1950, c. 319).

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State  
2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 1 of P. L. 1950, chapter 319 (C. 40:72-24.1) is amended  
2 to read as follows:

3 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in cities of the  
4 fourth class governed by chapters 70 to 76 of Title 40 ("Commis-  
5 sion Form of Government Law") of the Revised Statutes, and  
6 now or hereafter having the population hereinafter set forth, the  
7 compensation of the mayor and each commissioner shall be *within*  
8 *the limits* as hereinafter provided; and such salary shall be payable  
9 in equal monthly installments and shall be the total compensation  
10 payable to the mayor and the commissioners, except that such  
11 salary may be increased in the manner provided by section 40:72-24  
12 of the Revised Statutes for the increase of the salary as fixed by  
13 sections 40:72-21 and 40:72-22 of the Revised Statutes, but the  
14 amount of such increase shall in no instance exceed 50% of the  
15 salary provided in this act.

16 In such cities having from 2,500 to **[10,000]** 7,500 population, the  
17 mayor's annual salary shall **[be \$3,750.00]** not exceed \$6,000.00,  
18 and that of each commissioner shall **[be \$3,000.00]** not exceed  
19 \$5,000.00.

20 In such cities having from 7,500 to 10,000 population, the mayor's  
21 annual salary shall not exceed \$8,000.00 and that of each commis-  
22 sioner shall not exceed \$7,000.00.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill  
is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.
